PRODUCTION, SHIPMENTS AND STOCKS ON HAND OF SAWMILLS
IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

OOT 3 1957

Production of sawn lumber and ties in British Columbia totalled 400,576 M ft. in August, 1957 as compared with 476,259 M ft. in August, 1956 a decrease of 15.9 p.c. from the previous year and a decrease of 0.6 p.c. from the previous month. Production of Coast mills, which account for 47.7 p.c. of the total, showed a decrease of 8.1 p.c. from the same month of the previous year, and the Interior mills, which produced the remaining 52.3 p.c. showed a decrease of 21.9 p.c. Shipments in August, 1957 totalled 397,303 M ft., as compared with 441,726 M ft. the previous year, a decrease of 10.1 p.c. with Coast mills registering a decrease of 16.1 p.c. and Interior mills a decrease of 4.2 p.c. Total shipments for August increased by 8.4 p.c. over the July figure of 366,544 M ft. Stocks on hand at the end of August, 1957 amounted to 552,063 M ft., as compared with 514,515 M ft. at the end of August the previous year and 558,800 M ft. at the end of July of this year. Coast mills reported stocks totalling 266,798 M ft., while Interior mills showed 285,265 M ft.

Summary Figures

Table 1 gives a comparative summary of production, shipments and stocks of sawn lumber and ties for all British Columbia sawmills for July and August 1956 and 1957. Details by species are given for production and stocks while shipments are shown by destination. Total production increased from 414,520 M ft. in July, 1956 to 476,259 M ft. in August, 1956 but decreased from 403,028 M ft. in July, 1957 to 400,576 M ft. in August, 1957. Shipments totalled 366,544 M ft. in July, 1957 and 397,363 M ft. in August, 1957 as compared with 397,586 M ft. in July and 441,726 M ft. in August of 1956. Stocks on hand at sawmills decreased from 518,948 M ft. in July, 1956 to 514,515 M ft. in August, 1956 and decreased from 558,800 M ft. in July, 1957 to 552,063 M ft. in August of this year.

Production

Table 2 gives particulars of lumber and tie production for Coast mills and Interior mills separately, and also shows separately the production of lumber and ties, by species. Production of sawn lumber in Coast mills amounted to 190,091 M ft. in August, 1957 as compared with 206,071 M ft. reported by Interior mills. Sawn tie production of Coast mills was 851 M ft. in August as compared with 3,563 M ft. for Interior mills. Coast mills accounted for 47.7 p.c. of the total production of sawn lumber and ties in August, 1957 as compared with 43.6 p.c. the previous year. The percentages of Coast mills during July, 1957 and 1956 respectively, were 42.5 and 43.0 p.c.

Shipments

Table 3 gives details of lumber and tie shipments, by months, for Coast mills and Interior mills separately. Shipments by truck, by rail and waterborne are shown for each Canadian province, to points in the United States, to the United Kingdom and to other countries, for all mills reporting. Total estimated shipments of non-reporting mills are also given. It is to be noted, however, that some lumber originally reported as having been shipped to points in British Columbia may have been re-shipped to other provinces or exported by the purchasers and reported by them also, thereby causing a certain amount of duplication.

Shipments of Coast mills amounted to 181,052 M ft. in August of 1957 and 157,045 M ft. in July, 1957 as compared with 215,890 M ft. in August, 1956 and 184,878 M ft. in the previous month, while the Interior mills shipped 216,251 M ft. and 225,836 M ft. in August, 1957 and 1956 and 209,499 M ft. and 212,708 M ft. in July, 1957 and 1956. Of all shipments actually reported for August, 39.7 p.c. went to points in Canada, 41.4 p.c. to points in United States, 9.6 p.c. to the United Kingdom and 9.3 p.c. to other countries. Waterborne shipments accounted for 25.4 p.c. of the total, while 48.8 p.c. went by rail, and 25.8 p.c. by truck.

Stocks

Table 4 gives particulars of stocks of lumber and ties at sawmills by months. It distinguishes between stocks sold but not shipped and stocks unsold, and between stocks at Coast and Interior mills, by species. Total stocks at Coast mills in July and August, 1957 amounted to 259,022 M ft. and 266,798 M ft. as compared with 278,498 M ft. and 263,598 M ft. in July and August of 1956. Interior mills stocks increased from 240,450 M ft. in July to 250,917 M ft. in August, 1956 but decreased from 299,778 M ft. in July to 285,265 M ft. in August, 1957. Unsold stocks accounted for approximately 36.3 p.c. of the total in August, 1957 as compared with 31.2 p.c. in August, 1956 for Coast mills, while for the Interior mills the percentages were, respectively, 91.8 and 85.9.

Orders on Hand

Table 5 shows the distribution of orders on hand at the end of the months of July and August, 1956 and 1957 for Coast mills only. Similar information is not collected from Interior mills and no attempt has been made to estimate orders on hand of non-reporting mills on the Coast. Destination and mode of shipments are shown in this table, which also gives total lumber purchases reported by some mills. Total orders on hand at the end of August, 1957 amounted to 271,807 M ft. as compared with 275,703 M ft. in August, 1956. Orders on hand at the end of July, 1957 and 1956 amounted to 249,118 M ft. and 275,013 M ft., respectively. Purchases of lumber from other mills amounted to 11,143 M ft. in August, 1957 and 4,143 M ft. in August, 1956 as compared with 8,567 M ft. in July, 1957 and 5,659 M ft. in July, 1956.

Active Mills Reporting

Table 6 gives the number of active mills reporting each month for the Coast and Interior of British Columbia. The mills reporting for August accounted for 79.7 p.c. of the total production on the basis of the annual returns from 1955 compared with 78.1 p.c. for the previous year. The percentages for July, 1956 and 1957 were 80.1 and 78.1 respectively. It is hoped that the compilation will eventually include all mills in the 500,000 feet and over classification.
