Production of sawn lumber and ties in British Columbia totalled $350,750 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in December, 1958 as compared with $300,862 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in December, 1957 an increase of $16.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. over the previous year but a decrease of $6.7 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. from the previous month. Production of Coast mills, which accounts for 58.7 p.c. of the total, showed an increase of $17.3 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. over the same month of the previous year, and the Interior mills, which produced the remaining $41.3 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. showed an increase of $15.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Shipments in December, 1958 totalled $337,974 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. , as compared with $294,716 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. the previous year, an increase of $14.7 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. with Coast mills registering an increase of 16.2 p.c. and Interior mills an increase of 12.5 p.c. Total shipments for December decreased by $10.9 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. from the November figure of $379,183 \mathrm{Mft}$. Stocks on hand at the end of December, 1958 amounted to $536,870 \mathrm{M}$ ft., as compared with $585,852 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. at the end of December the previous year and $512,477 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. at the end of November of this year. Coast mills reported stocks totalling $319,154 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$., while Interior mills showed $217,716 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$.

## Summary Figures

Table 1 gives a comparative sumary of production, shipments and stocks of sawn lumber and ties for all British Columbia sawmills for November and December, 1957 and 1958. Details by species are given for production and stocks while shipments are shown by destination. Total production decreased from $338,873 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in November, 1957 to $300,862 \mathrm{Mft}$. in December, 1957 and from $376,068 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in November to $350,750 \mathrm{M}$ ft. in December, 1958. Shipments totalled $379,183 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in November, 1958 and $337,974 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in December, 1958 as compared with $351,511 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in November and $294,716 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in December of 1957. Stocks on hand at sawmills increased from $576,552 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in November, 1957 to $585,852 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in December and increased from $512,477 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in November, 1958 to $536,870 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in December of this year.

## Production

Table 2 gives particulars of lumber and tie production for Coast mills and Interior mills separately, and also shows separately the production of lumber and ties, by species. Production of sawn lumber in Coast mil1s amounted to $203,889 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in December, 1958 as compared with $143,975 \mathrm{M}$ ft. reported by Interior mills. Sawn tie production of Coast mills was $2,013 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in December as compared with 873 M ft . for Interior mills. Coast mills accounted for $58.7 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. of the total production of sawn lumber and ties in December, 1958 as compared with 58.4 p.c. the previous year. The percentages of Coast mills during November, 1958 and 1957 respectively, were 58.1 and 58.8 p.c.

## Shipments

Table 3 gives details oumber and tie shipments, by months, for Coast mills and Interior mills separately. Shipments by truck, by rail and waterborne are shown for each Canadian province, to points in the United States, to the United Kingdom and to other countries, for all mills reporting. Total estimated shipments of nonreporting mills are also given. It is to be noted, however, that some lumber originally reported as having been shipped to points in British Columbia may have been re-shipped to other provinces or exported by the purchasers and reported by them also, thereby causing a certain amount of duplication.

Shipments of Coast mills amounted to $202,773 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in December of 1958 and $220,271 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in November, 1958 as compared with $174,559 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in December, 1957 and $211,334 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in the previous month, while the Interior mills shipped 135,201 M ft . and $120,157 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in December, 1958 and 1957 and $158,912 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and 140,177 M ft. in November, 1958 and 1957. Of all shipments actually reported for December, 34.7 p.c. went to points in Canada, 42.7 p.c. to points in United States, 11.2 p.c. to the United Kingdom and $11.4 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. to other countries. Waterborne shipments accounted for $36.3 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. of the total, while $38.1 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. went by rail, and $25.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. by truck.

## Stocks

Table 4 gives particulars of stocks of lumber and ties at sawnills by months. It distinguishes between stocks sold but not shipped and stocks unsold, and between stocks at Coast and Interior mills, by species. Total stocks at Coast mills in November and December, 1958 amounted to $309,559 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $319,154 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. as compared with $281,131 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $289,600 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in November and December of 1957. Interior mills stocks increased from $295,421 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in November to $296,252 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in December, 1957 and increased from $202,918 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in November to $217,716 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in December, 1958. Unsold stocks accounted for approximately $35.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. of the total in December, 1958 as compared with 35.0 p.c. in December, 1957 for Coast mills, while for the Interior mills the percentages were, respectively, 96.2 and 94.6 .

Orders on Hand
Table 5 shows the distribution of orders on hand at the end of the months of November and December, 1957 and 1958 for Coast mills only. Similar information is not collected from Interior mills and no attempt has been made to estimate orders on hand of non-reporting mills on the Coast. Destination and mode of shipments are shown in this table, which also gives total lumber purchases reported by some mills. Total orders on hand at the end of December, 1958 amounted to $338,686 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. as compared with $295,273 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. In December, 1957. Orders on hand at the end of November, 1958 and 1957 amounted to $320,798 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $274,872 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft.}, \mathrm{respectively}$. Purchases of lumber from other mills amounted to $9,348 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft} .\mathrm{in} \mathrm{December}$,1958 and $7,062 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in December, 1957 as compared with $7,923 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft} .\mathrm{in} \mathrm{November}$,1958 and $6,727 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in November, 1957.

## Active Mills Reporting

Table 6 gives the number of active mills reporting each month for the Coast and Interior of British Columbia. The mills reporting for December accounted for 81.2 p.c. of the total production on the basis of the annual returns from 1956 compared with 80.2 p.c. for the previous year. The percentages for November, 1957 and 1958 were 80.2 and 79.8 respectively. It is hoped that the compilation will eventually include all mills in the 500,000 feet and over classification.
