Production of sawn lumber and ties in British Columbia totalled $341,243 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. April, 1958 as compared with $317,066 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in April, 1957 an increase of 7.6 p.c. over the previous year but a decrease of 13.6 pc . from the previousmonth. Production of Coast mills, which accounts for 64.4 p.c. of the total showed an increase of $14.9 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. over the same month of the previous year, but the Interior mills, which produced the remaining 35.6 p.c. showed a decrease of 3.5 p.c. Shipments in April, 1958 totalled 355,166 M ft., as compared with $329,807 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. the previous year, an increase of $7.7 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. With Coast mills registering an increase of $7.3 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. and Interior mills an increase of $8.4 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Total shipments for April decreased by $13.2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. from the March figure of $409,171 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. Stocks on hand at the end of April, 1958 amounted to $593,199 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft.}$, $672,003 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. at the end of April the previous year and $614,391 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. at the end of March of this year. Coast mills reported stocks totalling $292,252 \mathrm{M}$ ft., while Interior mills showed $300,947 \mathrm{Mft}$.

## Summary Figures

Table 1 gives a comparative sumary of production, shipments and stocks of sawn lumber and ties for all British Columbia sawills for March and April 1957 and 1958. Details by species are given for production and stocks while shipments are shown by destination. Total production decreased from 381,876 M ft. In March 1957 to 317,066 M ft. in April, 1957 and from $395,183 \mathrm{M} f t$. in March to $341,243 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in April, 1958. Shipments totalled $409,171 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft} .\mathrm{In} \mathrm{March}$,1958 and $355,166 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in April, 1958 as compared with $354,560 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in March and $329,807 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. In April of 1957 . Stocks on hand at sawmills increased from $670,137 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. In March, 1957 to $672,003 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. In April but decreased from $614,391 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in March, 1958 to $593,199 \mathrm{Mft}$. in April of this year.

## Production

Table 2 gives particulars of lumber and tie production for Coast mills and Interfor mills separately, and also shows separately the production of lumber and ties, by species. Production of sawn lumber in Coast mills amounted to $217,687 \mathrm{Mft}$. in April, 1958 as compared with $119,422 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. reported by Interior mills. Sawn tie production of Coast mills was $1,982 \mathrm{M}$ ft. In April as compared with $2,152 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. for Interior mills. Coast mills accounted for 64.4 p.c. of the total production of sawn lumber and ties in April, 1958 as compared with 60.3 p.c. the previous year. The percentages of Coast mills during March, 1958 and 1957 respectively, were 55.1 and 50.3 p.c.

## Shipments

Table 3 gives details of lumber and tie shipments, by months, for Coast mills and Interior mills separately. Shipments by truck, by rall and waterborne are shown for each Canadian province, to points in the United States, to the United Kingdom and to other countries, for all mills reporting. Total estimated shipments of non-reporting mills are also given. It is to be noted, however, that some lumber originally reported as having been shipped to points in British Columbia may have been re-shipped to other provinces or exported by the purchasers and reported by them also, thereby causing a certain amount of duplication.

Shipments of Coast mills amounted to $224,028 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$.in April of 1958 and $232,317 \mathrm{M}$ ft . in March, 1958 as compared with $208,826 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in April, 1957 and $201,641 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in the previous month, while the Interior mills shipped $131,138 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $120,981 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in April, 1958 and 1957 and $176,854 \mathrm{Mft}$. and $152,919 \mathrm{Mft}$. in March 1958 and 1957. Of all shipments actually reported for April, 36.3 p.c. went to points in Canada, 43.4 p.c. to points in United States, $11.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. to the United Kingdom and $8.8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. ©o other countries, Waterborne shipments accounted for $35.8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. of the total, while $42.1 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. went by rail, and 22.1 p.c. by truck.

## Stocks

Table 4 gives particulars of stocks of lumber and ties at sawmills by months. It distinguishes between stocks sold but not shipped and stocks unsold, and between stocks at Coast and Interior mills, by species. Total stocks at Coast mills in March and April, 1958 amounted to $293,083 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $292,252 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. as compared with $301,728 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $293,177 \mathrm{M}$ ft. In March and April of 1957. Interior mills stocks increased from 368,409 M ft. in March to $378,826 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. In April, 1957 but decreased from $321,308 \mathrm{Mft}$. in March to $300,947 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in April, 1958. Unsold stocks accounted for approximately $33.8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. of the total in April, 1958 as compared with 32.9 p.c. in April, 1957 for Coast mills, while for the Interior mills the percentages were, respectively, 91.8 and 91.9.

## Orders on Hand

Table 5 shows the distribution of orders on hand at the end of the months of March and April, 1957 and 1958 for Coast mills only. Similar information is not collected from Interior mills and no attempt has been made to estimate orders on hand of nonreporting mills on the Coast. Destination and mode of shipments are shown in this table, which also gives total lumber purchases reported by some mills. Total orders on hand at the end of April, 1958 amounted to $249,812 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. as compared with $299,325 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in April, 1957. Orders on hand at the end of March, 1958 and 1957 amounted to $252,313 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $295,241 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft} .$, respectively. Purchases of lumber from other mills amounted to 7,901 M ft . in April, 1958 and $6,359 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in April, 1957 as compared with $7,396 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in March, 1958 and $5,078 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft} .\mathrm{in} \mathrm{March} 1957.$,

## Active Mills Reporting

Table 6 gives the number of active mills reporting each month for the Coast and Interior of British Columbia. The mills reporting for April accounted for 80.6 p.c. of the total production on the basis of the annual returns from 1956 compared with 77.9 p.c. for the previous year. The percentages for March, 1957 and 1958 were 77.2 and 79.2 respectively. It is hoped that the compilation will eventually include all mills in the 500,000 feet and over classification.
