PRODUCTION, SHIPMENTS AND STOCKS ON HAND OF SAWMILLS
IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

Production of sawn lumber and ties in British Columbia totalled 402,602 M ft. in May, 1958 as compared with 374,277 M ft. in May, 1957 an increase of 7.6 p.c. over the previous year and an increase of 18.0 p.c. over the previous month. Production of Coast mills, which accounts for 57.3 p.c. of the total, showed an increase of 12.1 p.c. over the same month of the previous year, and the Interior mills, which produced the remaining 42.7 p.c. showed an increase of 2.1 p.c. Shipments in May, 1958 totalled 407,255 M ft., as compared with 440,371 M ft. the previous year, a decrease of 7.5 p.c. with Coast mills registering a decrease of 6.7 p.c. and Interior mills a decrease of 8.5 p.c. Total shipments for May increased by 14.7 p.c. over the April figure of 355,166 M ft. Stocks on hand at the end of May, 1958 amounted to 552,087 M ft., as compared with 593,689 M ft. at the end of May the previous year and 593,199 M ft. at the end of April of this year. Coast mills reported stocks totalling 291,626 M ft., while Interior mills showed 260,461 M ft.

Summary Figures

Table 1 gives a comparative summary of production, shipments and stocks of sawn lumber and ties for all British Columbia sawmills for April and May, 1957 and 1958. Details by species are given for production and stocks while shipments are shown by destination. Total production increased from 317,066 M ft. in April, 1957 to 374,-277 M ft. in May, 1957 and from 341,243 M ft. in April to 402,602 M ft. in May, 1958. Shipments totalled 355,166 M ft. in April, 1958 and 407,255 M ft. in May, 1958 as compared with 329,807 M ft. in April and 440,371 M ft. in May of 1957. Stocks on hand at sawmills decreased from 672,003 M ft. in April, 1957 to 593,689 M ft. in May and decreased from 593,199 M ft. in April, 1958 to 552,087 M ft. in May of this year.

Production

Table 2 gives particulars of lumber and tie production for Coast mills and Interior mills separately, and also shows separately the production of lumber and ties, by species. Production of sawn lumber in Coast mills amounted to 229,420 M ft. in May, 1958 as compared with 168,632 M ft. reported by Interior mills. Sawn tie production of Coast mills was 1,366 M ft. in May as compared with 3,184 M ft. for Interior mills. Coast mills accounted for 57.3 p.c. of the total production of sawn lumber and ties in May, 1958 as compared with 55.0 p.c. the previous year. The percentages of Coast mills during April, 1958 and 1957 respectively, were 64.4 and 60.3 p.c.

Shipments

Table 3 gives details of lumber and tie shipments, by months, for Coast mills and Interior mills separately. Shipments by truck, by rail and waterborne are shown for each Canadian province, to points in the United States, to the United Kingdom and to other countries, for all mills reporting. Total estimated shipments of non-reporting mills are also given. It is to be noted, however, that some lumber originally reported as having been shipped to points in British Columbia may have been reshipped to other provinces or exported by the purchasers and reported by them also, thereby causing a certain amount of duplication.

Shipments of Coast mills amounted to 226,258 M ft. in May of 1958 and 224,028 M ft. in April, 1958 as compared with 242,630 M ft. in May, 1957 and 208,826 M ft. in the previous month, while the Interior mills shipped 180,997 M ft. and 197,741 M ft. in May, 1958 and 1957 and 131,138 M ft. and 120,981 M ft. in April, 1958 and 1957. Of all shipments actually reported for May, 39.3 p.c. went to points in Canada, 42.1 p.c. to points in United States, 10.5 p.c. to the United Kingdom and 8.1 p.c. to other countries. Waterborne shipments accounted for 31.2 p.c. of the total, while 44.5 p.c. went by rail, and 24.3 p.c. by truck.

Stocks

Table 4 gives particulars of stocks of lumber and ties at sawmills by months. It distinguishes between stocks sold but not shipped and stocks unsold, and between stocks at Coast and Interior mills, by species. Total stocks at Coast mills in April and May, 1958 amounted to 292,252 M ft. and 291,626 M ft. as compared with 293,177 M ft. and 268,933 M ft. in April and May of 1957. Interior mills stocks decreased from 378,826 M ft. in April to 324,756 M ft. in May, 1957 and decreased from 300,947 M ft. in April to 260,461 M ft. in May, 1958. Unsold stocks accounted for approximately 35.7 p.c. of the total in May, 1958 as compared with 34.4 p.c. in May, 1957 for Coast mills, while for the Interior mills the percentages were, respectively, 87.8 and 92.9.

Orders on Hand

Table 5 shows the distribution of orders on hand at the end of the months of April and May, 1957 and 1958 for Coast mills only. Similar information is not collected from Interior mills and no attempt has been made to estimate orders on hand of non-reporting mills on the Coast. Destination and mode of shipments are shown in this table, which also gives total lumber purchases reported by some mills. Total orders on hand at the end of May, 1958 amounted to 249,603 M ft. as compared with 256,923 M ft. in May 1957. Orders on hand at the end of April, 1958 and 1957 amounted to 249,812 M ft. and 299,325 M ft., respectively. Purchases of lumber from other mills amounted to 8,894 M ft. in May, 1958 and 10,280 M ft. in May, 1957 as compared with 7,901 M ft. in April, 1958 and 6,359 M ft. in April, 1957.

Active Mills Reporting

Table 6 gives the number of active mills reporting each month for the Coast and Interior of British Columbia. The mills reporting for May accounted for 80.7 p.c. of the total production on the basis of the annual returns from 1956 compared with 77.9 p.c. for the previous year. The percentages for April, 1957 and 1958 were 77.9 and 80.6 respectively. It is hoped that the compilation will eventually include all mills in the 500,000 feet and over classification.

The co-operation of the British Columbia Lumber Manufacturers' Association, Interior Lumber Manufacturers' Association and Northern Interior Lumbermen's Association in the collection of these statistics is gratefully acknowledged.
