SEp on 19 PRODUCTION, SHIPMENTS AND STOCKS ON HAND OF SAMMILLSLIOTHE EIOUE IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

Production of sawn lumber and ties in British Columbia totalled 424,816 M ft. in July, 1958 as compared with $399,333 \mathrm{M}$ ft. in July, 1957 an increase of 6.4 p.c. over the previous year but a decrease of $1.4 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. from the previous month. Production of Coast mills, which accounts for 43.7 p.c. of the total, showed an increase of $11.4 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. over the same month of the previous year, and the Interior mills, which produced the remaining $56.3 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. showed an increase of 2.8 p.c. Shipments in July, 1958 totalled $439,917 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$., as compared with $366,544 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft} .\mathrm{the} \mathrm{previous} \mathrm{year}$, an increase of 20.0 p.c. with Coast mills registering an increase of $31.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$, and Interior mills an increase of 11.3 p.c. Total shipments for July decreased by 4.7 p.c. from the June figure of $461,767 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. Stocks on hand at the end of July, 1958 amounted to $514,644 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft.} \mathrm{as} \mathrm{compared} \mathrm{with} 558,,800 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. at the end of July the previous year and $547,149 \mathrm{Mft}$. at the end of June of this year. Coast mills reported stocks totalling $260,622 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$., while Interior mills showed $254,022 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$.

Summary Figures
Table 1 gives a comparative summary of production, shipments and stocks of sawn lumber and ties for all British Columbia sawmills for June and July, 1957 and 1958. Details by species are given for production and stocks while shipments are shown by destination. Total production decreased from $401,142 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1957 to 399,333 M ft. in July, 1957 and from $430,839 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June to $424,816 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in July, 1958. Shipments totalled $461,767 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1958 and $439,917 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in July, 1958 as compared with $460,381 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June and $366,544 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in July of 1957 . Stocks on hand at sawmills increased from $524,310 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1957 to $558,800 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in July, 1957 but decreased from $547,149 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1958 to $514,644 \mathrm{Mft}$. in July of this year.

Production
Table 2 gives particulars of lumber and tie production for Coast mills and Interior mills separately, and also shows separately the production of lumber and ties, by species. Production of sawn lumber in Coast mills amounted to $183,877 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in July, 1958 as compared with $236,566 \mathrm{M}$ ft. reported by Interior mills. Sawn tie production of Coast mills was $1,970 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in July as compared with $2,403 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. for Interior mills. Coast mills accounted for $43.7 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. of the total production of sawn lumber and ties in July, 1958 as compared with $41.8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. the previous year. The percentages of Coast mills during June, 1958 and 1957 respectively, were 51.6 and 48.6 p.c.

## Shipments

Table 3 gives details of lumber and tie shipments, by months, for Coast mills and Interior mills separately. Shipments by truck, by rail and waterborne are shown for each Canadian province, to points in the United States, to the United Kingdom and to other countries, for all mills reporting. Total estimated shipments of non-reporting mills are also given. It is to be noted, however, that some lumber originally reported as having been shipped to points in British Columbia may have been re-shipped to other provinces or exported by the purchasers and reported by them also, thereby causing a certain amount of duplication.

Shipments of Coast mills amounted to $206,719 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in July of 1958 and 245,954 M ft. in June, 1958 as compared with $157,045 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in July, 1957 and $255,926 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in the previous month, while the Interior mills shipped $233,198 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and 209,499 M ft. in July, 1953 and 1957 and $215,813 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $204,455 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1958 and 1957. Of all shipments actually reported for July, 41.1 p.c. went to points in Canada, 45.4 p.c. to points in United States, 5.8 p.c. to the United Kingdom and 7.7 p.c. to other countries. Waterborne shipments accounted for 28.5 p.c. of the total, while 45.6 p.c. went by rail, and 25.9 p.c. by truck.

## Stocks

Table 4 gives particulars of stocks of lumber and ties at sawmills by months. It distinguishes between stocks sold but not shipped and stocks unsold, and between stocks at Coast and Interior mills, by species. Total stocks at Coast mills in June and July, 1958 amounted to $276,372 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $260,622 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. as compared with $226,953 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $259,022 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June and July of 1957 . Interior mills stocks increased from $297,357 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June to $299,778 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in July, 1957 but decreased from $270,777 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June to $254,022 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in July, 1958 . Unsold stocks accounted for approximately 33.8 p.c. of the total in July, 1958 as compared with 37.8 p.c. in July, 1957 for Coast mills, while for the Interior mills the percentages were, respectively, 89.7 and 92.9 .

Orders on Hand
Table 5 shows the distribution of orders on hand at the end of the months of June and July, 1957 and 1958 for Coast mills only. Similar information is not collected from Interior mills and no attempt has been made to estimate orders on hand of nonreporting mills on the Coast. Destination and mode of shipments are shown in this table, which also gives total lumber purchases reported by some mills. Total orders on hand at the end of July, 1958 amounted to $302,092 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. as compared with 249,118 M. ft. in July, 1957. Orders on hand at the end of June, 1958 and 1957 amounted to $260,669 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $220,226 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$., respectively. Purchases of lumber from other mills amounted to $6,962 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in July, 1958 and $8,567 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in July, 1957 as compared with $10,775 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1958 and $10,750 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1957.

Active Mills Reporting
Table 6 gives the number of active mills reporting each month for the Coast and Interior of British Columbia. The mills reporting for July accounted for 80.1 p.c. of the total production on the basis of the annual returns from 1956 compared with 78.1 p.c. for the previous year. The percentages for June, 1957 and 1958 were 79.0 and 80.5 respectively. It is hoped that the compilation will eventually include all mills in the 500,000 feet and over classification.

The co-operation of the British Columbia Lumber Manufacturers' Association, Interior Lumber Manufacturers' Association and Northern Interior Lumbermen's Association in the collection of these statistics is gratefully acknowledged.
