Production of sawn lumber and ties in British Columbia totalled 363 G in November, 1959 as compared with $391,108 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in November, 1950 deerease 8 E 2.2 p.c. from the previous year and a decrease of 15.3 p.c. from the previous month. Production of Coast mills, which accounts for $64.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. of the total, showed an increase of 2.7 p.c. over the same month of the previous year, but the Interior mills, which produced the remaining $35.4 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., showed a decrease of $21.1 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Shipments in November, 1959 totalled $331,609 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$, as compared with $379,183 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. the previous year, a decrease of $12.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. with Coast mills registering a decrease of $12.3 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. and Interior mills a decrease of 12.9 p.c. Total shipments for November decreased by $19.9 \mathrm{p.c}$. from the October figure of $414,029 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. November, 1959 amounted to $600,482 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft.} \mathrm{as} \mathrm{compared} \mathrm{with} 512,,477 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. at the end of November the previous year and $564,229 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft} .\mathrm{at} \mathrm{the} \mathrm{end} \mathrm{of} \mathrm{October} \mathrm{of} \mathrm{this} \mathrm{year}$. Coast mills reported stocks totalling $349,155 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$., while Interior mills showed $251,327 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$.

## Summary Figures

Table l gives a comparative summary of production, shipments and stocks of sawn lumber and ties for all British Columbia sawmills for October and November 1958 and 1959. Details by species are given for production and stocks while shipments are shown by destination. Total production decreased from $492,588 \mathrm{M}$ ft. in October, 1958 to $391,108 \mathrm{M}$ ft. in November, 1958 and from $428,334 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft} \mathrm{in} \mathrm{October} \mathrm{to} 362,.776 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in November, 1959. Shipments totalled $414,029 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft.in}$ October, 1959 and 331, 609 M ft . in November, 1959 as compared with $500,191 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft} \mathrm{in} \mathrm{October} \mathrm{and} 379,.183 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in November of 1958. Stocks on hand at, sammills decreased from 521,372 M ft. in October, 1958 to $512,477 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in November but increased from $564,229 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in October, 1959 to $600,482 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in November of this year.

## Production

Table 2 gives particulars of lumber and tie production for Coast mills and Interior mills separately, and also shows separately the production of lumber and ties, by species. Production of sawn lumber in Coast mills amounted to $233,073 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in November, 1959 as compared with $127,194 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. reported by Interior mills. Sawn tie production of Coast mills was $1,265 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in November as compared with $1,244 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. for Interior mills. Coast mills accounted for $64.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. of the total production of sawn lumber and ties in November, 1959 as compared with 58.4 p.c. the previous year. The percentages of Coast mills during October, 1959 and 1958 respectively, were 58.1 and 51.9 p.c.

## Shipments

Table 3 gives details of lumber and tie shipments, by months, for Coast mills and Interior mills separately. Shipments by truck, by rail and waterborne are shown for each Canadian province, to points in the United States, to the United Kingdom and to other countries, for all mills reporting. Total estimated shipments of non-reporting mills are also given. It is to be noted, however, that some lumber originally reported as having been shipped to points in British Columbia may have been re-shipped to other provinces or exported by the purchasers and reported by them also, thereby causing a certain amount of duplication.

Shipments of Coast mills amounted to $193,178 \mathrm{M}$ ft. in November of 1959 and $222,425 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in October, 1959 as compared with $220,271 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in November, 1958 and $277,086 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in the previous month, while the Interior mills shipped $138,431 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $158,912 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in November, 1959 and 1958 and $191,604 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $223,105 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in October, 1959 and 1958. Of all shipments actually reported for November, 36.9 p.c. went to points in Canada, 38.9 p.c. to points in United States, 11.6 p.c. to the United Kingdom and 12.6 p.c. to other countries. Waterborne shipments accounted for 28.7 p.c. of the total, while 46.9 p.c. went by rail, and 24.4 p.c. by truck.

## Stocks

Table 4 gives particulars of stocks of lumber and ties at sawmills by months. It distinguishes between stocks sold but not shipped and stocks unsold, and between stocks at Coast and Interior mills, by species. Total stocks at Coast mills in October and November, 1959 amounted to $304,651 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $349,155 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. as compared with 304,165 M ft . and $309,559 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in October and November of 1958. Interior mills stocks decreased from $217,207 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in October to $202,918 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in November, 1958 and decreased from $259,578 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in October to $251,327 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in November, 1959. Unsold stocks accounted for approximately 40.2 p.c. of the total in November, 1959 as compared with 33.7 p.c. in November, 1958 for Coast mills, while for the Interior mills the percentages were, respectively, 95.1 and 95.0.

Orders on Hand
Table 5 shows the distribution of orders on hand at the end of the months of October and November, 1958 and 1959 for Coast mills only. Similar information is not collected from Interior mills and no attempt has been made to estimate orders on hand of non-reporting mills on the Coast. Destination and mode of shipments are shown in this table, which also gives total lumber purchases reported by some mills. Total orders on hand at the end of November, 1959 amounted to $385,828 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. as compared with $320,798 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. . in November, 1958. Orders on hand at the end of October, 1959 and 1958 amounted to $355,841 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $266,536 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$., respectively. Purchases of lumber from other mills amounted to $7,460 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in November, 1959 and $7,923 \mathrm{Mft}$. in November, 1958 as compared with $8,026 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in October, 1959 and $10,497 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in October, 1958.

## Active Mills Reporting

Table 6 gives the number of active mills reporting each month for the Coast and Interior of British Columbia. The mills reporting for November accounted for 80.8 p.c. of the total production on the basis of the annual returns from 1957 compared with 79.8 p.c. for the previous year. The percentages for October, 1958 and 1959 were 80.6 and 81.4 respectively. It is hoped that the compilation will eventually include all mills in the 500,000 feet and over classification.
