PRODUCTION, SHIPMENTS AND STOCKS ON HAND OF SAWMILLS

IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

January, 1961

Production of sawn lumber and ties in British Columbia totalled 413,737 M bd. ft. in January, 1961 as compared with 384,261 M bd. ft. in December, 1960. Shipments decreased in January, 1961 to 370,851 M bd. ft. from 391,214 in December, 1960. Stocks on hand showed an increase from 735,798 Mbd. ft. in December, 1960 to 777,954 M bd. ft. in January, 1961.

Table 1 gives a comparative summary of production, shipments and stocks of sawn lumber and ties for all British Columbia sawmills, while Table 2 gives particulars of lumber and tie production for Coast mills and Interior mills separately. Details of lumber and tie shipments by method of transport are given in Table 3, while Table 4 shows particulars of stocks of lumber and ties at sawmills. It should be noted that some lumber originally reported as having been shipped to points within British Columbia by some operators may also be reported as having been shipped by other operators, who, in addition to sawing lumber, also purchase or have lumber sawn by contract for them. This, of course, would result in some duplication.

Table 5 shows the distribution of orders on hand for Coast mills only, and also includes lumber purchases and some details of destination and method of transport. Total orders on hand at the end of January amounted to 373,328 M bd. ft. as compared with 419,337 M bd. ft. in December, 1960. Purchases from other mills amounted to 1,794 M bd. ft. in January, 1961, as compared with 2,549 M bd. ft. in December, 1960.

Table 6 gives the number of active mills reporting each month for the Coast and the Interior of British Columbia. The mills reporting for January accounted for 80 p.c. of the total production on the basis of the annual returns from 1958 compared with 77.5 p.c. for January of the previous year. It is to be hoped that the compilation will eventually include all mills in the 500,000 feet and over classification.

The co-operation of the British Columbia Lumber Manufacturers' Association, Interior Lumber Manufacturers' Association and Northern Interior Lumbermen's Association in the collection of these statistics is gratefully acknowledged.


