Production of sawn lumber and ties in British Columbia totalled 626,563 M bd. ft. in March 1964 as compared with 571,164 M bd. ft. in March 1963. Shipments increased in March 1964 to 620,944 M bd. ft. from 512,684 M bd. ft. in March 1963. Stocks on hand showed an increase from 895,832 M bd. ft. in March 1963 to 926,910 M bd. ft. in March 1964.

Table 1 gives a comparative summary of production, shipments and stocks of sawn lumber and ties for all British Columbia sawmills, while Table 2 gives particulars of lumber and tie production for Coast mills and Interior mills separately. Details of lumber and tie shipments by method of transport are given in Table 3, while Table 4 shows particulars of stocks of lumber and ties at sawmills. It should be noted that some lumber originally reported as having been shipped to points within British Columbia by some operators may also be reported as having been shipped by other operators, who, in addition to sawing lumber, also purchase or have lumber sawn by contract for them. This, of course, would result in some duplication.

Table 5 shows the distribution of orders on hand for Coast mills only, and also includes lumber purchases and some details of destination and method of transport.

Table 6 gives the number of mills reporting for the Coast and the Interior of British Columbia. The mills reporting for March accounted for 83.9 p.c. of the total production on the basis of the annual returns from 1961 compared with 79.4 p.c. for March of the previous year. It is to be hoped that the compilation will eventually include all mills in the 500,000 feet and over classification.

The co-operation of the British Columbia Lumber Manufacturers' Association, Interior Lumber Manufacturers' Association and Northern Interior Lumbermen's Association in the collection of these statistics is gratefully acknowledged.
