PRODUCTION, SHIPMENTS AND STOCKS ON HAND OF SAWMILLS IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

AUGUST 1964

the Production of sawn lumber and ties in British Columbia totalled 579,356 M bd. ft. in August 1964 as compared with 557,791 M bd. ft. in August 1963. Shipments decreased in August 1964 to 550,003 M bd. ft. from 599,918 in August 1963. Stocks on hand showed an increase from 700 252 M bd. ft. in August 1963 to 799,043 M bd. ft. in August 1964.

Table 1 gives a comparative summary of production, shipments and stocks of sawn lumber and ties for all British Columbia sawmills, while Table 2 gives particulars of lumber and tie production for Coast mills and Interior mills separately. Details of lumber and tie shipments by method of transport are given in Table 3, while Table 4 shows particulars of stocks of lumber and ties at sawmills. It should be noted that some lumber originally reported as having been shipped to points within British Columbia by some operators may also be reported as having been shipped by other operators, who, in addition to sawing lumber, also purchase or have lumber sawn by contract for them. This, of course, would result in some duplication.

Table 5 shows the distribution of orders on hand for Coast mills only, and also includes lumber purchases and some details of destination and method of transport.

Table 6 gives the number of mills reporting for the Coast and the Interior of British Columbia. The mills reporting for August accounted for 84.7 p.c. of the total production on the basis of the annual returns from 1962 compared with 78.5 p.c. for August of the previous year. It is to be hoped that the compilation will eventually include all mills in the 500,000 feet and over classification.

Page 2 gives the final estimates of the production of sawn lumber (excluding sawn ties) for British Columbia and provinces East of the Rockies for 1962, revised estimates for 1963 and the first seven months of 1964. Similar revised monthly estimates of sawn lumber production for all provinces (except Newfoundland), are contained in the August issue of the monthly report entitled "Production, Shipments and Stocks on Hand of Sawmills East of the Rockies".

The co-operation of the British Columbia Lumber Manufacturers' Association, Interior Lumber Manufacturers' Association and Northern Interior Lumbermen's Association in the collection of these statistics is gratefully adknowledged.
