PRODUCTION, SHIPMENTS AND STCCKS ON HAND OF SAWMILLS IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

MAY, 1948

Production of sawn lumber and ties in British Columbia totalled 210,821 M ft. in May. 1948, as compared with 237,723 M ft. in May, 1947, a decrease of 11.3 p.c. from the previous year and a decrease of 0.5 p.c. from the previous month. Production of Coast mills, which account for 82.2 p.c. of the total, showed a decrease of 2.3 p.c. from the same month the previous year, and the Interior mills, which produced the remaining 17.8 p.c., showed a decrease of 37.9 p.c. Shipments in May, 1948 totalled 230,128 M ft., as compared with 229,922 M ft. the previous year, an increase of 0.1 p.c., with Coast mills registering an increase of 6.7 p.c., and Interior mills a decrease of 26.0 p.c. Total shipments for May decreased by 2.9 p.c. from the April figure of 236.932 M ft. Stocks on hand at the end of May, 1948, amounted to 254,009 M ft., as compared with 217,727 M ft. the previous year and 265,206 M ft. at the end of April of this year. Coast mills reported stocks totalling 192,386 M ft., while Interior mills showed 61,623 M ft.

Summary Figures

Table 1 gives a comparative summary of production, shipments and stocks of sawn lumber and ties for all British Columbia sawmills for May, 1947 and 1948, and April, 1947 and 1948. Details by species are given for production and stocks, while shipments are shown by destination. Total production increased from 220,392 M ft. in April to 237,723 M ft. in May of 1947 but decreased from 211,946 M ft. in April 1948 to 210,821 M ft. in May. Shipments totalled 236,932 M ft. in April and 230,128 M ft. in May of this year as compared with 207,713 M ft. and 229,922 M ft. during the corresponding months last year. Stocks on hand at sawmills decreased from 224,036 M ft. in April, 1947 to 217,727 M ft. in May, and decreased from 265,206 M ft. in April 1948 to 254,009 M ft. in May.

Production

Table 2 give particulars of lumber and tie production for Coast mills and Interior mills separately, and also shows separately the production of lumber and ties, by species. Production of sawn lumber in Coast mills amounted to 165,558 M ft. in May, as compared with 34,907 M ft., reported by Interior mills. Sawn tie production of Coast mills was 7,709 M ft. in May, as compared with 2,647 M ft. for Interior mills. Coast mills accounted for 82.2 p.c. of the total production of sawn lumber and ties in May, 1948, as compared with 74.6 p.c. the previous year. The percentages for Coast Mills during April, 1948 and 1947, respectively, were 84.6 p.c. and 81.8 p.c.

Shipments

Table 3 gives details of lumber and tie shipments, by months, for Coast mills and Interior mills separately. Shipments by truck, by rail and waterborne are shown for each Canadian province, to points in the United States, to the United Kingdom and to other countries, for all mills reporting. Total estimated shipments of non-reporting mills are also given. It is to be noted, however, that some lumber originally reported as having been shipped to points in British Columbia may have been reshipped to other provinces or exported by the purchasers and reported by them also, thereby causing a certain amount of duplication.

Shipments of Coast mills amounted to 195,940 M ft., in May, 1948 and 199,529 M ft. in April as compared with 183,696 M ft. and 173,105 M ft. in the corresponding months of the previous year, while the Interior mills shipped 34,188 M ft., and 37,403 M ft. in 1948, and 46,226 M ft. and 34,608 M ft. during the corresponding months of the previous year. Of all shipments actually reported for May, 40.8 p.c. went to points in Canada, 24.3 p.c. to points in United States, 19.1 per cent to the United Kingdom, and 15.1 p.c. to other countries. Shipments to unspecified destinations accounted for the remainder (0.7 p.c.). Waterborne shipments accounted for 37.0 p.c. of the total, while 40.1 p.c. went by rail, about 22.2 p.c. by truck and 0.7 p.c. by unspecified carriers.

Stocks

Table 4 gives particulars of stocks of lumber and ties at sawmills, by months. It distinguishes between stocks sold but not shipped and stocks unsold, and between stocks at Coast and Interior mills, by species. Total stocks at Coast mills, in April and May of this year amounted to 194,648 M ft., and 192,386 M ft., as compared with 172,241 M ft. and 163,801 M ft. in April and May of 1947. Interior mills stocks increased from 51,795 M ft. in April, 1947 to 53,926 M ft. in May, 1947, but decreased from 70,558 M ft. in April, 1948 to 61,623 M ft. in May, 1948. Unsold stocks accounted for approximately 32.6 p.c. of the total in May, 1948, as compared with 30.8 p.c. in May, 1947 for Coast mills. while for the Interior mills the percentages were respectively, 77.2 and 71.5.

Orders on Hand

Table 5 shows the distribution of orders on hand at the end of the months of April and May, 1947 and 1948, for Coast mills only. Similar information is not collected from Interior mills and no attempt has been made to estimate orders on hand of non-reporting mills on the Coast. Destination and mode of shipments are shown in this table, which also gives total lumber purchases reported by some mills. Total orders on hand at the end of May, 1948, amounted to 480,924 M ft., as compared with 589,366 M ft. in May, 1947. Orders on hand at the end of April, 1948 and 1947, amounted to 487,361 M ft., and 576,265 M ft. respectively. Purchases of lumber from other mills amounted to 10,947 M ft. in May, 1947, 5,983 M ft. in May, 1948, as compared with 9,850 M ft. in April, 1947, and 7,327 M ft. in April, 1948.

Active Mills Reporting

Table 6 gives the number of active mills reporting each month, for the Coast and Interior of British Columbia. The mills reporting for May accounted for 81.1 p.c. of the total production on the basis of the annual returns from 1945, compared with 86.3 p.c. for the previous year. The percentages for April 1947 and 1948 were 84.4 and 89.3 respectively. It is hoped that the compilation will eventually include all mills in the 500,000 feet and over classification.

The co-operation of the British Columbia Lumber Manufacturers' Association, Western Lumber Manufacturers' Association of Canada, Interior Lumber Manufacturers' Association and Northern Interior Lumbermen's Association in the collection of these statistics is gratefully acknowledged.
