## PRODUCTION, SHIPMENTS AND STOCKS ON HAND OF SAWMILLS IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

## SEPTEMBER, 1948

Production of sawn lumber and ties in British Columbia totalled 236,872 M ft. in September 1948 as compared with 236,876 M ft. in September 1947, and 231,113 M ft. in August, 1948, an increase of 2.5 p.c. over the previous month. Production of Coast mills, which account for 71.5 p.c. of the total, showed an increase of 1.6 p.c. over the same month the previous year, and the Interior mills, which produced the remaining 28.5 p.c. showed a decrease of 3.9 p.c. Shipments in September, 1948 totalled 226,562 M ft., as compared with 222,344 M ft, the previous year, an increase of 1.9 p.c. with Coast mills registering an increase of 2,7 p.c. and Interior mills a decrease of 0.6 p.c. Total shipments for September decreased by 3.8 p.c. from the August figure of 235,557 M Ft. Stocks on hand at the end of September, 1948, amounted to 272,671 Mft. as compared with 246,342 Mft. the previous year and 275,671 Mft. at the end of August of this year. Coast mills reported stocks totalling 184,314 M ft., while Interior mills showed 91,357 M ft.

Summary Figures

Table 1 gives a comparative summary of production, shipments and stocks of sawn lumber and ties for all British Columbia sawmills for September, 1947 and 1948, and August, 1947 and 1948. Details by species are given for production and stocks, while shipments are shown by destination. Total production increased from 217,117 M ft. in August to 236,876 M ft. in September of 1947 and from 231,113 M ft. in August 1948 to 236,872 M ft. in September, Shipments totalled 235,557 M ft. in August and 226,562 M ft in September of this year as compared with 207,288 M ft. and 222,344 M ft, during the corresponding months last year. Stocks on hand at sawmills increased from 228,580 M ft. in August 1947 to 246,342 M ft. in September and from 263,829 M ft, in August 1948 to 275,671 M ft. in September.

#### Production

Table 2 gives particulars of lumber and tie production for Coast mills and Interior mills separately, and also shows separately the production of lumber and ties, by species. Production of sawn lumber in Coast mills amounted to 162,202 M ft, in September, as compared with 64,357 M ft. reported by Interior mills. Sawn tie production of Coast mills was 17,078 M ft. in September, as compared with 3,235 M ft. for Interior mills. Coast mills accounted for 71.5 p.c. of the total production of sawn lumber and ties in September, 1948, as compared with 70.3 p.c. the previous year. The percentages for Coast mills during August, 1948 and 1947, respectively, were 70.8 p.c. and 64.3 p.c.

## Shipments

Table 3 gives details of lumber and tie shipments, by months for Coast mills and Interior mills separately. Shipments by truck, by rail and waterborne are shown for each Canadian province, to points in the United States, to the United Kingdom and to other countries, for all mills reporting. Total estimated shipments of non-reporting mills are also given. It is to be noted, however, that some lumber originally reported as having been shipped to points in British Columbia may have been reshipped to other provinces or exported by the purchasers and reported by them also, thereby causing a certain amount of duplication.

Shipments of Coast mills amounted to 173,247 M ft., in September of 1948 and 178,779 M ft. in August as compared with 168,707 M ft. and 153,513 M ft. in the corresponding months of the previous year, while the Interior mills shipped 53,315 M ft. and 56,778 M ft. in 1948, and 53,637 M ft. and 53,775 M ft. during the corresponding months of the previous year. Of all shipments actually reported for September, 49.0 p.c. went to points in Canada, 25.8 p.c. to points in United States, 15.9 per cent to the United Kingdom, and 8.6 p.c. to other countries. Shipments to unspecified destinations accounted for the remainder (0.7 p.c.). Waterborne shipments accounted for 28.8 p.c. of the total, while 48.2 p.c. went by rail, about 22.3 p.c. by truck and 0.7 p.c. by unspecified carriers.

#### Stocks

Table 4 gives particulars of stocks of lumber and ties at sawmills by months. It distinguishes between stocks sold but not shipped and stocks unsold, and between stocks at Coast and Interior mills, by species. Total stocks at Coast mills, in August and September of this year amounted to 179,203 M ft. and 184,314 M ft. as compared with 155,404 M ft. and 159,090 M ft. in August and September of 1947. Interior mills stocks increased from 73,176 M ft. in August 1947 to 87,252 M ft. in September, 1947, and from 84,626 M ft. in August 1948 to 91,357 M ft. in September 1948. Unsold stocks accounted for approximately 32.6 p.c. of the total in September, 1948, as compared with 37.4 p.c. in September, 1947 for Coast mills, while for the Interior mills the percentages were respectively, 76.5 and 80.9

#### Orders on Hand

Table 5 shows the distribution of orders on hand at the end of the months of August and September, 1947 and 1948, for Coast mills only. Similar information is not collected from Interior mills and no attempt has been made to estimate orders on hand of non-reporting mills on the Coast. Destination and mode of shipments are shown in this table, which also gives total lumber purchases reported by some mills. Total orders on hand at the end of September, 1948, amounted to 345,259 M ft., as compared with 531,099 M ft. in September 1947. Orders on hand at the end of August 1948 and 1947, amounted to 408,337 M ft. and 540,540 M ft., respectively. Purchases of lumber from other mills amounted to 8,720 M ft. in September, 1947, 7,812 M ft. in September, 1948, as compared with 4,297 M ft. in August, 1947 and 8,131 M ft. in August, 1948.

# Active Mills Reporting

Table 6 gives the number of active mills reporting each month, for the Coast and Interior of British Columbia. The mills reporting for September accounted for 76.3 p.c. of the total production on the basis of the annual returns from 1945, compared with 85.3 p.c. for the previous year. The percentages for August 1947 and 1948 were 81.8 and 81.1, respectively. It is hoped that the compilation will eventually include all mills in the 500,000 feet and over classification.

The co-operation of the British Columbia Lumber Manufacturers' Association, Western Lumber Manufacturers' Association of Canada, Interior Lumber Manufacturers' Association and Northern Interior Lumbermen's Association in the collection of these statistics is gratefully acknowledged.
