## PRODUCTION, SHIPMENTS AND STOCKS ON HAND OF SAWMILLS IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

Production of sawn lumber and ties in British Columbia totalled 390,982 M ft. in June, 1954 as compared with $344,926 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1953 an increase of $13.4 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. over the previous year and an increase of 22.1 p.c. over the previous month. Production of Coast mills, which account for $61.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. of the total, showed an increase of $11.7 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. over the same month of the previous year, and the Interior mills, which produced the remaining $38.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. showed an increase of 16.0 p.c. Shipments in June, 1954 totalled $387,678 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$., as compared with $329,450 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. the previous year, an increase of 17.7 p.c. with Coast mills registering an increase of 12.9 p.c. and Interior mills an increase of $26.9 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Total shipments for June increased by 10.4 p.c. over the May figure of $35 \mathrm{l}, 145 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. Stocks on hand at the end of June, 1954 amounted $463,206 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$, as compared with $416,451 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. at the end of June the previous year and $451,704 \mathrm{Mft}$, at the end of May of this year. Coast mills reported stocks totalling $270,741 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$., while Interior mills showed $192,465 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$.

## Summary Figures

Table 1 gives a comparative summary of production, shipments and stocks of sawn lumber and ties for all British Columbia sawmills for May and June, 1953 and 1954. Details by species are given for production and stocks while shipments are shown by destination. Total production increased from $313,551 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in May, 1953 to $344,926 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1953 and from $320,193 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in May to $390,982 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1954. Shipments totalled $351,145 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in May, 1954 and $387,678 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1954 as compared with $318,802 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in May and $329,450 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June of 1953. Stocks on hand at sawmills increased from $416,302 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in May, 1953 to 416,451 M ft. in June, 1953 and increased from $451,704 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in May, 1954 to $463,206 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June of this year.

## Production

Table 2 gives particulars of lumber and tie production for Coast mills and Interior mills separately, and also shows separately the production of lumber and ties, by species. Production of sawn lumber in Coast mills amounted to $240,382 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1954 as compared with $145,954 \mathrm{M}$ ft. reported by Interior mills. Sawn tie production of Coast mills was 225 M ft . in June as compared with $4,421 \mathrm{Mft}$. for Interior mills. Coast mills accounted for 61.5 p.c. of the total production of sawn lumber and ties in June, 1954 as compared with 62.4 p.c. the previous year. The percentages of Coast mills during May, 1954 and 1953 respectively, were 68.4 and 69.7 p.c

Table 3 gives details of lumber and tie shipments, by months, for Coast mills and Interior mills separately. Shipments by truck, by rail and waterborne are shown for each Canadian province, to points in the United States, to the United Kingdom and to other countries, for all mills reporting. Total estimated shipments of nonwreporting mills are also given. It is to noted, however, that some lumber originally reported as having been shipped to points in British Columbia may have been re-shipped to other provinces or exported by the purchasers and reported by them also, thereby causing a certain amount of duplication.

Shipments of Coast mills amounted to $245,438 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June of 1954 and $229,697 \mathrm{M}$ ft. in May, 1954 as compared with $217,341 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft.in} \mathrm{June}$,1953 and $230,076 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in the previous month, while the Interior mills shipped $142,240 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $112,109 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1954 and 1953 and $121,448 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft} \mathrm{and} 88,.726 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in May, 1954 and 1953. Of all shipments actually reported for June, 34.6 p.c. went to points in Canada, $38.7 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. to points in United States, $16.2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. to the United Kingdom and 10.5 p.c. to other countries. Waterborne shipments accounted for 37.3 p.c. of the total, while 42.3 p.c. Went by rail, and 20.4 p.c. by truck.

## Stocks

Table 4 gives particluars of stocks of lumber and ties at sawmills by months. It distinguishes between stocks sold but not shipped and stocks unsold, and between stocks at Coast and Interior mills, by species. Total stocks at Coast mills in May and June, 1954 amounted to $273,537 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $270,741 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. as compared with $238,298 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$, and $236,76 \mathrm{l} \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in May and June of 1953 . Interior mills stocks increased from $178,004 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in May to $179,690 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1953 and increased from $178,167 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in May to $192,465 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1954 . Unsold stocks accounted for approximately 28.9 p.c. of the total in June, 1954 as compared with 28.0 p.c. in June, 1953 for Coast mills, while for the Interior mills the percentages were, respectively, 81.5 and 84.4 .

## Orders on Hand

Table 5 shows the distribution of orders on hand at the end of the months of May and June, 1953 and 1954 for Coast mills only. Similar information is not collected from Interior mills and no attempt has been made to estimate orders on hand of nonoreporting mills on the Coast. Destination and mode of shipments are shown in this table, which also gives total lumber purchases reported by some mills. Total orders on hand at the end of June, 1954 a mounted to $359,049 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. as compared with $261,593 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1953. Orders on hand at the end of May, 1954 and 1953 amounted to $307,045 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. and $269,054 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft.}, \mathrm{respectively} .\mathrm{Pur} \mathrm{-}$ chases of lumber from other mills amounted to $4,778 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1954 and $6,514 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in June, 1953 as compared with $4,340 \mathrm{M} \mathrm{ft}$. in May, 1954 and 5,408 M ft. in May, 1953.

## Active Mills Reporting

Table 6 gives the number of active mills reporting each month for the Coast and Interior of British Columbia. The mills reporting for June accounted for 79.6 p.c. of the total production on the basis of the annual returns from 1952 com pared with 78.8 p.c. for the previous year. The percentages for May, 1953 and 1954 were 82.5 and 82.0 respectively. It is hoped that the compilation will eventwally include all mills in the 500,000 feet and over classification.

The co-operation of the British Columbia Lumber Manufacturers' Association, Interior Lumber Manufacturers' Association and Northern Interior Lumber men's Association in the collection of these statistics is gratefully acknowledged.
