PRODUCTION, SHIPMENTS AND STOCKS ON HAND OF SAWMILLS IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

Production of sawn lumber and ties in British Columbia totalled 390,982 M ft. in June, 1954 as compared with 344,926 M ft. in June, 1953 an increase of 13.4 p.c. over the previous year and an increase of 22.1 p.c. over the previous month. Production of Coast mills, which account for 61.5 p.c. of the total, showed an increase of 11.7 p.c. over the same month of the previous year, and the Interior mills, which produced the remaining 38.5 p.c. showed an increase of 16.0 p.c. Shipments in June, 1954 totalled 387,678 M ft., as compared with 329,450 M ft. the previous year, an increase of 17.7 p.c. with Coast mills registering an increase of 12.9 p.c. and Interior mills an increase of 26.9 p.c. Total shipments for June increased by 10.4 p.c. over the May figure of 351,145 M ft. Stocks on hand at the end of June, 1954 amounted 463,206 M ft., as compared with 416,451 M ft. at the end of June the previous year and 451,704 M ft. at the end of May of this year. Coast mills reported stocks totalling 270,741 M ft., while Interior mills showed 192,465 M ft.

Summary Figures

Table I gives a comparative summary of production, shipments and stocks of sawn lumber and ties for all British Columbia sawmills for May and June, 1953 and 1954. Details by species are given for production and stocks while shipments are shown by destination. Total production increased from 313,551 M ft. in May, 1953 to 344,926 M ft. in June, 1953 and from 320,193 M ft. in May to 390,982 M ft. in June, 1954. Shipments totalled 351,145 M ft. in May, 1954 and 387,678 M ft. in June, 1954 as compared with 318,802 M ft. in May and 329,450 M ft. in June of 1953. Stocks on hand at sawmills increased from 416,302 M ft. in May, 1953 to 416,451 M ft. in June, 1953 and increased from 451,704 M ft. in May, 1954 to 463,206 M ft. in June of this year.

Production

Table 2 gives particulars of lumber and tie production for Coast mills and Interior mills separately, and also shows separately the production of lumber and ties, by species. Production of sawn lumber in Coast mills amounted to 240,382 M ft. in June, 1954 as compared with 145,954 M ft. reported by Interior mills. Sawn tie production of Coast mills was 225 M ft. in June as compared with 4,421 M ft. for Interior mills. Coast mills accounted for 61.5 p.c. of the total production of sawn lumber and ties in June, 1954 as compared with 62.4 p.c. the previous year. The percentages of Coast mills during May, 1954 and 1953 respectively, were 68.4 and 69.7 p.c.

Shipments

Table 3 gives details of lumber and tie shipments, by months, for Coast mills and Interior mills separately. Shipments by truck, by rail and waterborne are shown for each Canadian province, to points in the United States, to the United Kingdom and to other countries, for all mills reporting. Total estimated shipments of non-reporting mills are also given. It is to noted, however, that some lumber originally reported as having been shipped to points in British Columbia may have been re-shipped to other provinces or exported by the purchasers and reported by them also, thereby causing a certain amount of duplication.

Shipments of Coast mills amounted to 245,438 M ft. in June of 1954 and 229,697 M ft. in May, 1954 as compared with 217,341 M ft. in June, 1953 and 230,076 M ft. in the previous month, while the Interior mills shipped 142,240 M ft. and 112,109 M ft. in June, 1954 and 1953 and 121,448 M ft. and 88,726 M ft. in May, 1954 and 1953. Of all shipments actually reported for June, 34.6 p.c. went to points in Canada, 38.7 p.c. to points in United States, 16.2 p.c. to the United Kingdom and 10.5 p.c. to other countries. Waterborne shipments accounted for 37.3 p.c. of the total, while 42.3 p.c. went by rail, and 20.4 p.c. by truck.

Stocks

Table 4 gives particluars of stocks of lumber and ties at sawmills by months. It distinguishes between stocks sold but not shipped and stocks unsold, and between stocks at Coast and Interior mills, by species. Total stocks at Coast mills in May and June, 1954 amounted to 273,537 M ft. and 270,741 M ft. as compared with 238,298 M ft. and 236,761 M ft. in May and June of 1953. Interior mills stocks increased from 178,004 M ft. in May to 179,690 M ft. in June, 1953 and increased from 178,167 M ft. in May to 192,465 M ft. in June, 1954. Unsold stocks accounted for approximately 28.9 p. c. of the total in June, 1954 as compared with 28.0 p.c. in June, 1953 for Coast mills, while for the Interior mills the percentages were, respectively, 81.5 and 84.4.

Orders on Hand

Table 5 shows the distribution of orders on hand at the end of the months of May and June, 1953 and 1954 for Coast mills only. Similar information is not collected from Interior mills and no attempt has been made to estimate orders on hand of non-reporting mills on the Coast. Destination and mode of shipments are shown in this table, which also gives total lumber purchases reported by some mills. Total orders on hand at the end of June, 1954 amounted to 359,049 M ft. as compared with 261,593 M ft. in June, 1953. Orders on hand at the end of May, 1954 and 1953 amounted to 307,045 M ft. and 269,054 M ft., respectively. Purchases of lumber from other mills amounted to 4,778 M ft. in June, 1954 and 6,514 M ft. in June, 1953 as compared with 4,340 M ft. in May, 1954 and 5,408 M ft. in May, 1953.

Active Mills Reporting

Table 6 gives the number of active mills reporting each month for the Coast and Interior of British Columbia. The mills reporting for June accounted for 79.6 p.c. of the total production on the basis of the annual returns from 1952 compared with 78.8 p.c. for the previous year. The percentages for May, 1953 and 1954 were 82.5 and 82.0 respectively. It is hoped that the compilation will eventually include all mills in the 500,000 feet and over classification.
