

PRODUCTION, SHIPMENTS AND STOCKS ON HAND OF SAWMILLS IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

Production of sawn lumber and ties in British Columbia totalled 440, 149 M ft. in June, 1955 as compared with 417,326 M ft. in June, 1954 an increase of 5.5 p. c. over the previous year and an increase of 14.8 p. c. over the previous month. Production of Coast mills, which account for 57.0 p. c. of the total, showed an increase of 4.2 p. c. over the same month of the previous year, and the Interior mills, which produced the remaining 43.0 p. c. showed an increase of 7.3 p. c. Shipments in June, 1955 totalled 432,722 M ft., as compared with 387,678 M ft. the previous year, an increase of 11.6 p. c. with Coast mills registering an increase of 5.9 p. c. and Interior mills an increase of 21.5 p. c. Total shipments for June increased by 8.1 p. c. over the May figure of 400,430 M ft. Stocks on hand at the end of June, 1955 amounted to 480,005 M ft., as compared with 463,206 M ft. at the end of June the previous year and 476,038 M ft. at the end of May of this year. Coast mills reported stocks totalling 285,157 M ft., while Interior mills showed 194,848 M ft.

Summary Figures

Table 1 gives a comparative summary of production, shipments and stocks of sawn lumber and ties for all British Columbia sawmills for May and June 1954 and 1955. Details by species are given for production and stocks while shipments are shown by destination. Total production increased from 338,208 M ft. in May, 1954 to 417,326 M ft. in June, 1954 and from 383,376 M ft. in May to 440,149 M ft. in June, 1955. Shipments totalled 400,430 M ft. in May, 1955 and 432,722 M ft. in June, 1955 as compared with 351,145 M ft. in May and 387,678 M ft. in June of 1954. Stocks on hand at sawmills increased from 451,704 M ft. in May, 1954 to 463,206 M ft. in June and increased from 476,038 M ft. in May, 1955 to 480,005 M ft. in June of this year.

Production

Table 2 gives particulars of lumber and tie production for Coast mills and Interior mills separately, and also shows separately the production of lumber and ties, by species. Production of sawn lumber in Coast mills amounted to 248,625 M ft. in June, 1955 as compared with 187,386 M ft. reported by Interior mills. Sawn tie production of Coast mills was 2,284 M ft. in June as compared with 1,854 M ft. for Interior mills. Coast mills accounted for 57.0 p. c. of the total production of sawn lumber and ties in June, 1955 as compared with 61.5 p. c. the previous year. The percentages of Coast mills during May, 1955 and 1954 respectively, were 63.0 and 68.4 p. c.

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Shipments

Table 3 gives details of lumber and tie shipments, by months, for Coast mills and Interior mills separately. Shipments by truck, by rail and waterborne are shown for each Canadian province, to points in the United States, to the United Kingdom and to other countries, for all mills reporting. Total estimated shipments of non-reporting mills are also given. It is to be noted, however, that some lumber originally reported as having been shipped to points in British Columbia may have been re-shipped to other provinces or exported by the purchasers and reported by them also, thereby causing a certain amount of duplication.

Shipments of Coast mills amounted to 259,854 M ft. in June of 1955 and 250,020 M ft. in May, 1955 as compared with 245,438 M ft. in June, 1954 and 229,697 M ft. in the previous month, while the Interior mills shipped 172,868 M ft. and 142,240 M ft. in June, 1955 and 1954 and 150,410 M ft. and 121,448 M ft. in May, 1955 and 1954. Of all shipments actually reported for June, 36.72 p. c. went to points in Canada, 39.79 p. c. to points in United States, 14.10 p. c. to the United Kingdom and 9.39 p. c. to other countries. Waterborne shipments accounted for 34.04 p. c. of the total, while 43.65 p. c. went by rail, and 22.31 p. c. by truck.

Stocks

Table 4 gives particulars of stocks of lumber and ties at sawmills by months. It distinguishes between stocks sold but not shipped and stocks unsold, and between stocks at Coast and Interior mills, by species. Total stocks at Coast mills in May and June, 1955 amounted to 291,797 M ft. and 285,157 M ft. as compared with 273,537 M ft. and 270,741 M ft. in May and June of 1954. Interior mills stocks increased from 178,167 M ft. in May to 192,465 M ft. in June, 1954 and increased from 184,241 M ft. in May to 194,848 M ft. in June, 1955. Unsold stocks accounted for approximately 26.4 p. c. of the total in June, 1955 as compared with 28.9 p. c. in June, 1954 for Coast mills, while for the Interior mills the percentages were, respectively, 80.9 and 81.5.

Orders on Hand

Table 5 shows the distribution of orders on hand at the end of the months of May and June, 1954 and 1955 for Coast mills only. Similar information is not collected from Interior mills and no attempt has been made to estimate orders on hand of non-reporting mills on the Coast. Destination and mode of shipments are shown in this table, which also gives total lumber purchases reported by some mills. Total orders on hand at the end of June, 1955 amounted to 359,135 M ft. as compared with 359,049 M ft. in June, 1954. Orders on hand at the end of May, 1955 and 1954 amounted to 353,852 M ft. and 307,045 M ft., respectively Purchases of lumber from other mills amounted to 7,096 M ft. in June, 1955 and 4,778 M ft. in June, 1954 as compared with 5,230 M ft. in May, 1955 and 4,340 M ft. in May, 1954.

Active Mills Reporting

Table 6 gives the number of active mills reporting each month for the Coast and Interior of British Columbia. The mills reporting for June accounted for 77.8 p. c. of the total production on the basis of the annual returns from 1953 compared with 79.6 p. c. for the previous year. The percentages for May, 1954 and 1955 were 82.0 and 78.5 respectively. It is hoped that the compilation will eventually include all mills in the 500,000 feet and over classification.

The co-operation of the British Columbia Lumber Manufacturers' Association, Interior Lumber Manufacturers' Association and Northern Interior Lumbermen's Association in the collection of these statistics is gratefully acknowledged.
