

WOOD-USING INDUSTRIES IN CANADA, 1937.

Ottawa, May, 1939. - Sawmills and pulp-mills draw their raw material directly from the forest in the form of logs and pulp-wood, and produce sawn lumber, other sawmill products, and pulp and paper. There are also a number of important industries which use the products of the sawmills as raw material for further manufacture. Some of them produce commodities made almost entirely of wood, others manufacture articles in which wood is the most important component. These several industries are known as the "Wood-Using Industries" and are dealt with in the present report. Together with the lumber industry, the pulp and paper industry, and the paper-using industries, they form the "Wood and Paper" group, according to the chief component material classification of the Industrial Census.

In subdividing the different wood-using industries into the sixteen groups described in this bulletin, the classification has been based on the principal product reported by each individual firm. If a manufacturer's output consists chiefly of sash, doors, and planing mill products, his operations are grouped with planing mills, although he may also report the production of furniture, boxes and woodenware as side lines or by-products. Similarly an establishment specializing in woodenware will be classed as such, although it may also produce sash, doors and boxes as side lines. The statistics of each group of industries as discussed in this report should be considered with this fact in view. However, in Table II all the products of the wood-using industries are combined and arranged in alphabetical order for convenient reference. In this table are listed mattresses, bed springs and other products in which wood is not the chief component material but which have been produced as side lines in wood-using industries. Complete figures for the production of any one individual commodity by all classes of industries can be secured on application to the Bureau, where a central card index compilation of commodity production is maintained.

INDUSTRIES UTILISANT LE BOIS AU CANADA, 1937.

Ottawa, mai 1939. - Les scieries et les pulperies tirent leurs matières premières directement de la forêt, sous forme de billots et bois à pulpe, et produisent du bois d'œuvre, des sous-produits des scieries, de la pulpe et du papier. Mais il existe bon nombre d'autres industries importantes qui travaillent et transforment les produits des scieries; certaines d'entre elles produisent des articles entièrement en bois; d'autres, des objets dans lesquels le bois joue le rôle essentiel. Ces industries s'appellent "Industries utilisant le bois" et forment l'objet du présent rapport. Avec l'industrie du sciage, l'industrie de la pulpe et du papier, et les industries utilisant le papier, elles forment le groupe "Bois et papier", selon la classification d'après la principale matière constitutive, en usage au Recensement Industriel.

Dans la subdivision des différentes industries utilisant le bois en seize groupes décrits dans ce bulletin, la classification est basée sur le produit principal déclaré par chaque établissement individuel. Si les châssis, les portes et le bois raboté sont les produits principaux d'une manufacture, ces opérations sont placées sous l'en-tête "ateliers de rabotage", bien que le même établissement puisse aussi déclarer une production de meubles, boîtes et autres articles en bois comme à côté ou produits secondaires. De même, un établissement se spécialisant en ustensiles en bois est classé comme tel, bien qu'il produise aussi des châssis, portes, boîtes et autres menus objets. C'est un point qu'il ne faut pas oublier en étudiant les statistiques de chaque industrie dont traite ce rapport. Toutefois, dans le Tableau II, tous ces produits des industries utilisant le bois ont été combinés et sont présentés par ordre alphabétique en anglais, avec la traduction française en regard. On trouve dans cette liste des matelas, des sommiers et autres produits dans lesquels le bois n'est pas la principale matière, mais qui sont tout de même sortis des industries utilisant le bois. On peut se procurer les chiffres complets sur la production de tout article distinct sur demande au Bureau, où il est gardé un fichier de toute la production du pays.

Total production in the wood-using industries in Canada during 1937 reached a value of \$87,696,283, an increase of close to thirteen million dollars from the output of \$74,728,115 reported in 1936. The 2,048 establishments engaged in this line of manufacture represented a capital investment of \$95,903,348 and gave employment to an average of 31,677 employees. The cost of materials used in these industries amounted to \$42,469,362, as against \$36,206,467 in 1936, and the value added by manufacture was \$43,657,874, as compared to \$37,027,889 in 1936.

With 770 plants, Ontario accounted for 47.3 per cent of the total production in 1937. The 764 establishments in Quebec produced 24.4 per cent. In British Columbia, 197 plants produced 15.1 per cent, followed by Manitoba's 74 plants with 3.5 per cent and Alberta's 47 establishments with 3.2 per cent. There were 113 plants in Nova Scotia, 46 in New Brunswick, 27 in Saskatchewan and 10 in Prince Edward Island, accounting for 3.0 per cent, 2.6 per cent, 0.7 per cent and 0.2 per cent respectively.

Capital engaged in plants in operation during 1937 amounted to \$95,903,734, a slight increase over the \$95,303,734 reported in the previous year. Lands, buildings, fixtures, machinery and other equipment were worth \$52,930,844; materials on hand, stocks in process, finished products, fuel and miscellaneous supplies on hand, \$23,293,863; and operating capital (cash, bills and accounts receivable, prepaid expenses, etc.), \$19,679,-224. The greatest investment was in the sash, doors and millwork group at \$29,653,158, or 30.9 per cent of the total for all wood-using industries; \$27,445,103 or 28.6 per cent was invested in the furniture industry; \$12,283,460 or 12.8 per cent in miscellaneous wood-using industries; \$7,927,779 or 8.3 per cent in boxes, baskets and crates; and smaller percentages in the other industries. Ontario with 50.1 per cent of the total for Canada had the highest investment at \$48,076,031, of which \$25,435,294 was invested in lands, buildings and machinery. Quebec was next with \$23,100,-333. In British Columbia the capital was \$9,967,885, in Manitoba, \$3,767,988; in Nova Scotia, \$3,255,398; in Alberta, \$3,193,302; in New Brunswick, \$2,835,297; and in Saskatchewan \$1,366,857. Prince Edward Island reported the lowest investment at \$340,257.

An explanation is necessary of the method used throughout the Industrial Census for compiling statistics relating to employment. Each establishment reports the number of employees on its pay lists on the fifteenth of each month, and these monthly figures are added together and divided by twelve, irrespec-

La production totale des industries utilisant le bois au Canada en 1937 atteint une valeur de \$87,696,283, soit une augmentation de près de treize millions de dollars sur la production de \$74,728,115 rapportée en 1936. Les 2,048 établissements en exploitation dans ces industries représentent un engagement capital de \$95,903,348 et ont occupé en moyenne 31,677 personnes. Le coût des matières premières s'élève à \$42,469,362 comparativement à \$36,206,467 en 1936, et la valeur ajoutée par la fabrication s'élève à \$43,657,874, comparativement à \$37,027,889 l'année précédente.

Les 770 établissements de l'Ontario ont contribué 47.3 p.c. de la production totale en 1937. Les 764 établissements du Québec en ont fourni 24.4 p.c. Dans la Colombie Britannique 197 ateliers ont produit 15.1 p.c., puis viennent les 74 du Manitoba avec 3.5 p.c. et les 47 de l'Alberta avec 3.2 p.c. L'on compte 113 établissements en Nouvelle-Ecosse, 46 au Nouveau-Brunswick, 27 en Saskatchewan et 10 dans l'Île du Prince-Edouard, contribuant 3.0 p.c., 2.6 p.c., 0.7 p.c., et 0.2 p.c. respectivement.

Les capitaux engagés dans les établissements actifs en 1937 se montent à \$95,-903,734, soit une légère augmentation sur les \$95,303,734 rapportés l'année précédente. Les terrains, bâtiments, machineries, outillages, etc., sont estimés à \$52,930,844; l'inventaire des matières premières, les stocks en voie de fabrication, les produits finis, le combustible et les fournitures diverses en mains, à \$23,-293,863; et le capital de roulement (caisse, billets et factures à recouvrer, dépenses payées d'avance, etc.), à \$19,679,224. Le plus fort engagement de capitaux est représenté par l'industrie des portes et châssis, à \$29,653,-158 soit 30.9 p.c. du total pour toutes ces industries du bois; \$27,445,103 ou 28.6 p.c. sont engagés dans l'industrie du meuble; \$12,283,460 ou 12.8 p.c. dans les industries diverses du bois; \$7,927,779 ou 8.3 p.c. dans les boîtes et caisses; et de plus faibles pourcentages dans les autres industries. L'Ontario, avec 50.1 p.c. du total pour le Canada, a le plus fort engagement de capitaux, soit \$48,076,031, dont \$25,435,294 pour les terrains, bâtiments et machineries. Le Québec vient ensuite avec \$23,100,333; la Colombie Britannique montre un capital de \$9,967,885; le Manitoba, \$3,767,988; la Nouvelle-Ecosse \$3,255,398; l'Alberta \$3,193,302; le Nouveau-Brunswick \$2,835,297; et la Saskatchewan \$1,366,857. L'Île du Prince-Edouard a le plus petit capital, soit \$340,257.

tive of the period during which the plant was in operation. This gives employment for the year on a quantity basis in terms of man-years. The employment figures given in this report therefore represent the number of years' work for an individual furnished by the industry rather than the number of individuals given employment.

The average employment in the wood-using industries was 31,677 man-years or 10.3 per cent more than the previous year. Salaries and wages in Canada for the entire group of wood-using industries totalled \$27,054,807 as against \$23,184,941 in 1936. Employment in Ontario amounted to 14,981 man-years with a total pay-roll of \$13,608,616. Quebec to 8,937 man-years at \$6,547,106 in salaries and wages, and British Columbia to 3,537 at \$3,556,040. The furniture industry ranked first in employment at 10,804, sash, doors and millwork came second with 8,369, and boxes, baskets and crates third with 3,675.

Working hours varied considerably in each industry and in each province. In the wood-using industries as a whole, 16.0 per cent worked 48 hours per week, 15.7 per cent 44 hours, 13.4 per cent from 45 to 47 hours, 12.7 per cent 60 hours and over, 10.3 per cent 55 hours, 9.5 per cent from 49 to 50 hours, 7.3 per cent 54 hours, 5.5 per cent 40 hours or less, 5.2 per cent from 56 to 59 hours, 2.7 per cent from 51 to 53 hours and 1.7 per cent from 41 to 43 hours per week. Employment in these industries in 1937 rose steadily from 22,703 in January to 28,654 in July and then declined gradually to 25,386 in December.

Total power equipment in the wood-using industries in 1937 amounted to 121,027 H.P., as compared to 117,924 in 1936. Of the total for 1937, 95.4 per cent was ordinarily in use and 4.6 per cent in reserve or idle. Of the equipment ordinarily in use, 58.1 per cent was provided by electric motors on current purchased from central electric stations and amounted to 67,101 H.P.; the remainder, which was primary power generated by power plants within the industry, amounted to 48,338 H.P. of which 38,787 H.P., provided by steam engines, 1,447 H.P. by Diesel engines, 3,833 H.P. by gasoline, gas and oil engines (other than Diesel) and 4,271 H.P. by hydraulic turbines or water wheels. In addition there were ordinarily in use 686 electric motors rated at 5,899 H.P. operated by generated power and 620 boilers rated at 57,577 H.P.

Expenditures for fuel in the wood-using industries reached a total value of \$668,580 in 1937. A total of 58,905 tons of

Les chiffres de l'emploiement contenus dans ce rapport représentent donc l'équivalent du nombre d'années de travail que l'industrie aurait fournies à un individu et non pas le nombre de personnes ayant actuellement reçu de l'emploi au cours de l'année.

La moyenne de l'emploiement dans les industries utilisant le bois a été de 31,677 homme-années en 1936, soit 10.3 p.c. de plus que l'année précédente. Les salaires et gages pour l'ensemble de ces industries forment un total de \$27,054,807, comparativement à \$23,184,941 en 1936. L'emploiement dans l'Ontario s'élevait à 14,981 homme-années et les salaires et gages étaient de \$13,608,616. Dans le Québec on compte 8,937 homme-années et \$6,547,106 et dans la Colombie Britannique 3,537 homme-années et \$3,556,040. L'industrie du meuble tient le premier rang pour l'emploiement avec 10,804; celle des portes et châssis vient en deuxième avec 8,369, et celle des boîtes et paniers est troisième avec 3,675.

Les heures de travail varient énormément dans chaque industrie et dans chaque province. Pour l'ensemble des industries utilisant le bois, 16 p.c. des employés à gages ont travaillé 48 heures par semaine, 15.7 p.c. 44 heures, 13.4 p.c. de 45 à 47 heures, 12.7 p.c. 60 heures et plus, 10.3 p.c. 55 heures, 9.5 p.c. de 49 à 50 heures, 7.3 p.c. 54 heures, 5.5 p.c. 40 heures ou moins, 5.2 p.c. de 56 à 59 heures, 2.7 p.c. de 51 à 53 heures et 1.7 p.c. de 41 à 43 heures par semaine. De janvier à juillet 1937, les chiffres de l'emploiement ont augmenté chaque mois, de 22,703 à 28,654; ils ont ensuite baissé graduellement, jusqu'à 25,386 en décembre.

La force motrice à la disposition des industries utilisant le bois en 1937 s'élève à 121,027 h.p., comparativement à 117,924 h.p. en 1936. Du total de 1937, 95.4 p.c. était ordinairement en usage et 4.6 était en réserve ou inactive. De la force motrice ordinairement en usage, 58.1 p.c. soit 67,101 h.p. provenait de moteurs électriques mis par du courant acheté des usines centrales électriques; le reste, représentant la force primaire générée dans les établissements mêmes, s'élevait à 48,338 h.p., dont 38,787 h.p. provenant d'engins à vapeur, 1,447 h.p. de moteurs Diesel, 3,833 h.p. de moteurs à gazoline, à gaz et à l'huile (autres que Diesel) et 4,271 h.p. de turbines ou roues hydrauliques. En plus, il y avait ordinairement en usage 686 moteurs électriques, développant 5,899 h.p., mis par l'électricité produite par les établissements mêmes, et 620 chaudières capables de développer 57,577 h.p.

Le combustible consommé dans les industries utilisant le bois en 1937 atteint une valeur totale de \$668,580. On a brûlé 58,905

bituminous coal valued at \$368,801, 24,855 cords of wood at \$82,871, millwaste at \$68,024, gas at \$45,665 and fuel oil at \$34,321 were among the more important items. The cost of fuel in Ontario amounted to \$378,987, and in Quebec to \$152,146. The furniture industry showed the greatest consumption of fuel with a total expenditure of \$274,005. Fuel used in the sash, doors and millwork industry amounted to \$114,059; and in miscellaneous wood-using industries to \$123,458.

In 1937 the wood-using industries purchased 48,775,471 kilowatt-hours of electric energy, an increase of 12.2 per cent over the previous year's consumption of 43,477,022 kilowatt-hours. The cost of this electricity in 1937 amounted to \$900,467 of which \$383,297 was spent in Ontario and \$220,175 in Quebec. The sash, door and planing mills alone used over 17 million kilowatt-hours at a cost of \$358,863.

The raw materials used in the wood-using industries in 1937 cost \$42,469,362, as against \$36,206,467 in 1936 and formed 48.4 per cent of the total value of finished products in both 1936 and 1937.

Lumber and logs used in the wood-using industries as a group totalled 799,035 M ft.b.m. valued at \$21,897,754, of which 607,467 M ft.b.m., or 76 per cent of the total quantity, valued at \$14,610,882, was softwood and 191,568 M ft.b.m., or 24 per cent, valued at \$7,286,872 was hardwood. Sash, door and planing mills recorded the greatest consumption of lumber among the wood-using industries with a total of 359,248 M ft.b.m. of softwood valued at \$9,525,093 and 26,777 M ft.b.m. of hardwood valued at \$1,230,815, and the box, basket and crate industry ranked second with a total of 167,391 M ft.b.m. valued at \$3,000,396. The furniture industry used 56,279 M ft.b.m. of hardwood, valued at \$2,323,222, and 26,474 M ft.b.m. of softwood, valued at \$663,661. In addition, furniture frames valued at \$517,373 were purchased. Limber was purchased to the amount of 62,583 M ft.b.m., valued at \$2,174,769, in the hardwood flooring industry, hardwood accounting for 56,177 M ft.b.m. valued at \$1,992,513. Bolts used in the wood-using industries amounted to 88,047 cords and were valued at \$432,180 during the year. Veneer and plywood were used to the extent of 42,512 M surf. ft. of veneer valued at \$1,411,162 and 21,957 M surf. ft. of plywood valued at \$816,423.

Heading, staves and wooden hoops for slack and tight cooperage were also used to a large extent and formed the major part of the

En 1937 les industries utilisant le bois ont acheté 48,775,471 kilowatt-heures d'énergie électrique, soit une augmentation de 12.2 p.c. sur la consommation de l'année précédente qui était de 43,477,022 kilowatt-heures. Le coût de l'électricité en 1937 se totalise à \$900,467, dont \$383,297 pour l'Ontario et \$220,175 pour le Québec. A elle seule l'industrie des portes et châssis a dépensé au delà de 17 millions de kilowatt-heures d'électricité au coût de \$358,863.

Les matières premières employées par les industries utilisant le bois ont coûté \$42,469,362 en 1937, comparativement à \$36,206,- 467 en 1936; elles forment 48.4 p.c. de la valeur totale des produits finis en 1936 et en 1937.

Le bois d'œuvre et les billots utilisés dans ces industries représentent un total de 799,035 M p.m.p., évalués à \$21,897,754, dont 607,467 M p.m.p., ou 76 p.c. de la quantité totale, valant \$14,610,882, de bois tendre, et 191,568 M p.m.p., ou 24 p.c. évalués à \$7,- 286,872, de bois dur. Les fabriques de portes et châssis et ateliers de rabotage réclament la plus forte consommation de bois d'œuvre de toutes ces industries, soit 359,248 M p.m.p. de bois tendre, valant \$9,525,093, et 26,777 M p.m.p. de bois dur, valant \$1,230,815. L'industrie des boîtes et caisses vient ensuite avec un total de 167,391 M p.m.p. d'une valeur de \$3,000,396. Dans l'industrie du meuble on a employé 56,279 M p.m.p. de bois dur valant \$2,323,222 et 26,474 M p.m.p. de bois tendre valant \$663,661. On a aussi acheté pour \$517,373 de châssis de meubles dans cette industrie. Pour les parquets en bois dur on a dépensé 56,177 M p.m.p. de bois dur valant \$1,992,313; et cette même industrie a aussi consommé 6,406 M p.m.p. de bois tendre valant \$182,456. Sous forme de billotins, ces industries ont employé au cours de l'année 88,047 cordes de bois, d'une valeur de \$432,180. Elles ont aussi dépensé 42,512 M p.sup. de bois déroulé, évalué à \$1,- 411,162, et 21,957 M p. sup. de bois contre-plaqué valant \$816,423.

Dans l'industrie de la tonnellerie, les fonds et douves et les cercles en bois ont été utilisés dans une large mesure et forment

materials employed in cooperage. Their cost value aggregated \$798,232, of which \$257,614 or 32.3 per cent represented the value of tight staves; \$246,539 or 30.9 per cent the value of slack staves; \$142,541 or 17.8 per cent the value of slack heading; \$93,932 or 11.8 per cent the value of tight heading; and \$57,606 or 7.2 per cent the value of wooden hoops. Barrels for repairing or remaking valued at \$66,843 were also purchased in this industry. The purchase of hubs, spokes, bent goods, etc., reported by the carriage, sleigh and vehicle supply industry totalled \$5,597. Blocks, blanks, squares and other wood valued at \$730,-715 were used in the various industries, principally in the handles, spools and wood-turning, lasts, trees and wooden shoefindings and furniture industries. The purchase of all other materials including timber, etc. for preservation, such as piling, posts, poles, ties, etc., amounted to \$15,793,083.

Production in the wood-using industries of Canada reached the value of \$87,-696,283 in 1937, showing an increase of 17.3 per cent over the corresponding figure of \$74,728,115 recorded in 1936. The most important class of products on the list was sash, doors and millwork which were sold to the amount of \$11,757,515, followed by upholstered living-room furniture at \$6,588,787. Bedroom furniture was valued at \$5,008,938; planed lumber at \$4,715,519; matched lumber (exclusive of hardwood flooring) at \$4,260,-628; box shocks at \$3,735,317; dining-room furniture at \$2,586,998; boxes and containers, n.e.s., and parts at \$2,537,479; office and store furniture and fixtures at \$2,300,-425; plywood at \$2,030,861; household furniture, n.e.s., at \$1,973,444; caskets at \$1,884,726; kitchen furniture at \$1,614,001; furniture and fixtures for churches and other public buildings at \$1,359,069; birch hardwood flooring at \$1,269,204; radio cabinets at \$1,258,997; mouldings at \$1,221,090; maple hardwood flooring at \$903,508; wooden heels at \$804,064; and fruit and vegetable baskets and crates at \$758,369.

The following tables give, first, a review of the principal statistics of the wood-using industries from 1923 to 1937, followed by a summary of the principal statistics for 1936 and 1937, and detailed tables covering capital invested, employment, power equipment, fuel, electricity, materials used and products manufactured.

La production des industries canadiennes utilisant le bois a atteint une valeur de \$87,696,282 en 1937, soit une augmentation de 17.3 p.c. sur le chiffre correspondant pour 1936 qui n'était que \$74,728,115. La classe la plus importante de produits est celle des portes, châssis et autres bois ouvrés qui s'élève à \$11,757,515. Les meubles rembourrés de salon, évalués à \$6,588,787, viennent ensuite. Les meubles de chambre à coucher sont évalués à \$5,008,938, puis viennent le bois raboté (\$4,715,519), le bois bouveté (à l'exclusion des parquets en bois dur) (\$4,260,628), les planchettes à boîtes (\$3,735,317), les meubles de salle à manger (\$2,586,998), les boîtes et récipients, n.a.é.
