THE HARDWOOD FLOORING INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1932.

Ottawa, January, 1934. During 1931, a number of firms in Canada, specializing in the manufacture of hardwood flooring, made application to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for treatment under the Census of Industry as a separate industrial group. Up until this time these manufactures had been classed, for the most part, with the sash, door, planing mill and sawmill groups. Owing to the increased interest in late years in Canadian made flooring it was felt that this group was entitled to recognition as a separate industry.

There are, of course, a number of other firms manufacturing hardwood flooring as a side line only which are not included in this group. The firms in the group have a production capacity of over a hundred illion feet a year of this product and while their reported output for 1932 was only about twenty-eight million feet, the greater part of the total Canadian output was produced in their mills.

The present report shows the production of 23 establishments of which 10 are located in Ontario, 8 in Quebec, 2 in British Columbia, 2 in New Brunswick and 1 in Saskatchewan. Capital invested amounted to \$5,240,932, employment was furnished to 1,097 people to whom \$894,751 was distributed in wages and salaries.

The industry used raw material valued at \$1,615,589, the principal item being 31,763 ft. b.m. of rough hardwood lumber and logs. The gross value of products was \$2,890,522, the principal items being 28,303 ft. b.m. of hardwood flooring valued at \$1,573,745 14,973,000 ft. b.m. of other planed lumber valued at \$410,365 and \$468,191 worth of sash, doors and other millwork.

By the use of a special supplementary questionnaire, additional details concerning this industry are now collected. Manufactures are asked to report their purchases for flooring separately in the case of the oak; the quantities which were quarter—cut white, plain white, quarter—cut red and plain red. They are also asked to report separately the quantities of hardwood flooring made from each of these species and grades of materials.

The following tables include a summary of the principal statistics of the group, the distribution of its mills, capital invested, employment, salaries and wages, fuel used, power employed, materials used, products manufactured, kinds of lumber used in manufacturing hardwood flooring and classes of hardwood flooring produced.


