# THE BOX, BASKET AND CRATE INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1932 and 1933.

Ottawa, November, 1934. — A report on the box, basket and crate industry in Canada for 1932 and 1933 has just been issued by the Forestry Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. This report gives the production of firms engaged wholly or chiefly in the manufacture of wooden boxes of all classes and it covers the greater part of the production of these commodities in Canada. There are, however, a number of other firms classified in other industrial groups which make these containers as a side line or by-product to their principal production.

There were 138 factories engaged wholly or chiefly in the manufacture of boxes, baskets and crates in 1935 compared with 129 in 1932. The total capital invested in 1933 was \$7,367,845, the total number of employees of all classes was 2,849 and the salaries and wages paid amounted to \$1,871,729. Materials valued at \$2,393,054 were purchased and the gross value of the products manufactured was \$5,354,858.

The province of Ontario with 58 mills out of a total of 138 was the most important with regard to this industry. The remaining establishments were distributed as follows: - Quebec 26, British Columbia 19, Nova Scotia 12, Manitoba 9, Alberta 5, Prince Edward Island 2, Saskatchewan 1 and New Brunswick 6.

Tables 1 and 2 of this report give a summary of the principal statistics of the industry and the distribution of the mills by provinces for 1932 and 1933.

Sawn lumber, the greater part of which was softwood, formed the principal raw material and amounted to over one hundred and sixteen million feet, board measure, in 1933 valued at \$1,677,223. Bolts cost \$232,679, veneer \$120,100, plywood \$59,869 and other materials \$303,183 with a total of \$2,393,054 for all materials used. The other important materials were nails, hoop, band and other iron and miscellaneous hardware.

The products manufactured in the order of their importance with regard to value were: - unspecified boxes and containers \$1,736,311, box shooks \$1,923,890, fruit and vegetable baskets and crates \$723,918, butter boxes \$204,679, cheese boxes \$111,614, cigar boxes \$95,039, berry boxes \$123,761 and all other baskets \$49,709, making a total for the principal products of \$4,991,877. In addition to these principal products, the industry also manufactured secondary products such as sash, doors, millwork, planed and matched lumber, veneer, woodenware, handles, etc., to the value of \$362,981, making the total gross value of production \$5,354,858.

Tables 3 and 4 give the details of the materials used and products manufactured in this industry.

The total capital invested in the industry in 1933 was \$7,367,845 of which 63 per cent was invested in land, buildings and equipment, 12 per cent in materials and supplies, 5 per cent in products on hand and the remaining 20 per cent in operating capital.

Table 5 gives the details of capital invested in the industry in 1932 and 1933.

Of the 2,849 employees in the industry in 1933, 2,569 were men, 290 being paid on salary basis and 2,279 being wage-earners. Out of a total of 280 women employed, 46 were salaried and 234 were wage-earners.

Table 6 gives the details concerning employment in this industry in 1932 and 1933.

The manufacturers of boxes, baskets and crates purchased fuel to the value of \$23,554 in 1933. The fuel was chiefly bituminous coal and wood with smaller quantities of anthracite coal, gasoline, fuel oil, gas and coke. In 1933, 15,521 horse-power was used in these establishments made up of 6,530 horse-power from steam engines, 6,674 horse-power from electric motors operated on purchased power, 2,023 horse-power from hydraulic turbines and 294 horse-power from internal combustion engines,

Tables 7 and 8 give details concerning fuel used and power consumed in this industry.

A list of the names and addresses of firms engaged wholly or chiefly in the manufacture of boxes, baskets and crates forms an appendix to the report.
