THE COFFIN AND CASKET INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1931 and 1932.

Ottawa, December, 1933 - A report on the munufacture of coffins, caskets and shells or rough boxes in Canada during 1931 and 1932 has been completed by the Forestry Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. There were 37 firms engaged in the manufacture of these products in 1932 and 35 in 1931. The total amount of capital invested in the industry increased from \$3,685,003 in 1931 to \$3,909,852 in 1932. The employees of all classes numbered 777 in 1932 as compared to 787 in 1931. The total payroll in 1932 was \$821,763 and in 1931 \$887,323. This industry in 1932 purchased \$20,508 worth of fuel and employed power to the amount of 1,470 horse-power. Its materials in 1932 cost \$886,830 and its total products were valued at \$2,444,673.

Out of the total of 37 factories 15 were located in Ontario, 11 in Quebec, 3 cach in Nova Scotia, and British Columbia, 2 in Manitoba and one each in Saskatchewan, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island.

Tables 1 and 2 give a summary of the principal statistics of this industry and the distribution of its factories by provinces.

Tables 3, 4, 5 and 6 cover capital invested, employment, fuel used and power employed during 1931 and 1932.


Table 7 gives details of the materials used in 1931 and 1932. The chief material used by the manufacturers of coffins and caskets is lumber which was purchased to the extent of 10,263 m. ft. board measure costing \$358,269. About seventy-four per cent of this lumber was softwood, used chiefly in the manufacture of rough boxes and shells. The next important items were linings and coverings for coffins and caskets. Hardware and mountings; nails, tacks and screws; paint, oil and varnish were other important materials purchased.

Table 8 gives the details of the products manufactured in 1931 and 1932. This industry in 1932 turned out over sixty-four thousand caskets valued at \$1,843,699, over eight thousand coffins at \$85,657 and over forty-seven thousand rough boxes and shells valued at \$242,883. Undertakers' supplies to the value of \$215,542 also formed a part of the products of the industry.




