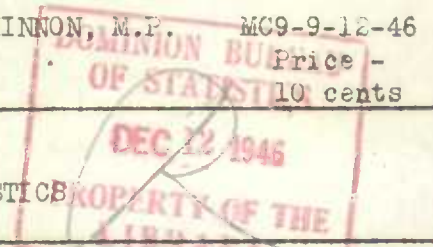

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CONCRETE BUILDING BLOCKS AND CEMENT PIPE

OCTOBER, 1946

This report on concrete building materials covers production by 50 of the principal manufacturers which normally account for 85 per cent of the total for Canada. Output in October included the following items: brick, 622,339 pieces; hollow blocks, 1,231,216 pieces; solid blocks, 1,000 pieces; cinder blocks, 514,318 pieces; and pipe, 8,550 tons.
