

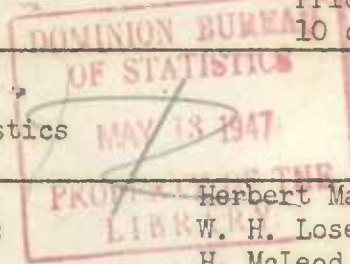

CONCRETE BUILDING BLOCKS AND CEMENT PIPE

MARCH, 1947

This report on concrete building materials covers production by 50 of the principal manufacturers which normally account for 85 per cent of the total for Canada. Output in March included the following items: brick, 1,057,275 pieces; hollow blocks, 855,554 pieces; cinder blocks, 424,443 pieces; and pipe, 8,305 tons.

Note: Figures given in this table cover the production of 50 firms which normally account for the following percentages of the total output in Canada of these items: concrete bricks and solid blocks, 100 per cent; concrete hollow blocks, 80 per cent; cinder blocks, 100 per cent; cement pipe, 92 per cent.
