

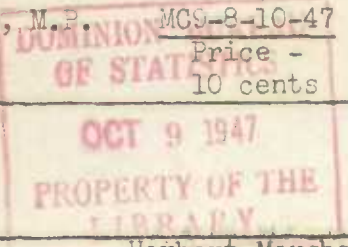

CONCRETE BUILDING BLOCKS AND CEMENT PIPE

AUGUST, 1947

This report on concrete building materials covers production by 85 of the principal manufacturers which normally account for 85 per cent of the total for Canada. Output in August included the following items: brick, 1,497,609 pieces; hollow blocks, 2,389,575 pieces; cinder blocks, 577,749 pieces; solid blocks, 19,166 pieces; and pipe, 13,708 tons.

Production in Canada and Factory Shipments of Specified Concrete Products, August and Year to Date, 1947

Note: Figures given in this table cover the production of 85 firms which normally account for the following percentages of the total output in Canada of these items: concrete bricks and solid bricks, 100 per cent; concrete hollow blocks, 80 per cent; cinder blocks, 100 per cent; cement pipe, 92 per cent.
