THE IMPORTED-CLAY PRODUCTS INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1926.

According to a statement issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa the output in Canada of commodities made from imported clays amounted in value to \$2,039,514 in 1926. This was an increase of 18 per cent over the value of \$1,741,745 in the previous year which in turn was slightly under the \$1,879,769 reported for 1924. Among the products made in Canada from clays imported for the purpose, were insulators valued at \$1,027,280, firebrick and other refractories worth \$323,168 and many other lines including sewer pipe, ceramic floor tile and sanitary wares.

In 1926 returns were received from 12 plants, 7 of which were located in Ontario and 5 in Quebec. These concerns employed a capital of \$2,849,558, gave work to a monthly average of 597 people whose earnings aggregated \$783,448 for the year. By the manufacturing processes these concerns added \$1,519,296 to the value of raw materials which cost \$520,218. Production from plants in Ontario amounted in value to \$1,222,865 and in Quebec to \$816,649.
