MANUFACTURES OF THE NON-METALLIC MINERALS

FINAL SUMMARY STATISTICS - 1945

According to finally revised figures, the production in 1945 by the manufacturing industries which used non-metallic minerals as their principal materials amounted to \$405,736,477 at factory prices, a decrease of 2.5 per cent from the corresponding 1944 value of \$416,268,879. A drop of \$9 millions in the petroleum products industry accounted for most of this recession.

In 1945 the number of operating factories in this group was 789, distributed by provinces as follows: Ontario, 382; Quebec, 198; British Columbia, 56; Alberta, 43; Manitoba, 38; Saskatchewan, 29; New Brunswick, 20; Nova Scotia, 21; Prince Edward Island, 1; and the Northwest Territories, 1. The number of employees increased to 32,525 from 31,590 in 1944, and payments for salaries and wages rose to \$57,193,679 as against \$56,130,338. Materials for manufacturing cost \$231,341,920 in 1945, and fuel and electricity cost \$29,197,514.

Ten of the industries in this group showed increases in output values in 1945 as compared with 1944, and five industries showed declines from last year. The percentage gains were as follows: Asbestos, 19.2; cement products, 38.2; cement, 21.9; glass, 3.1; products from Canadian clays, 27.3; products from imported clays, 20.4; stone products, 18.9; salt, 1.6; sand-lime brick, 45.8; and gypsum products 12.5. The declines were: abrasives, 15.2; coke and gas, 1.6; lime, 4.5; petroleum products, 4.2; and the miscellaneous industry, 32.5.

The principal statistics for this group are given by industries and by provinces in the summary tables which follow. The Bureau has also issued a comprehensive rotaprint report on each industry.

Imports into Canada for non-metallic minerals and their products totalled \$265,405,010 in 1945 compared with \$271,014,110 in 1944. Exports of Canadian produce were appraised at \$59,555,035 during 1945 as against \$58,398,213 in the previous year.
