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## COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA

October 1925.

Production of coke in Canada during the month of October amounted to amounted to 161,414 tons, the greatest output of any month this year and an increase of 57 per cent over the 102.882 tons produced in September. Coke produced in the eastern provinces rose to 56,714 tons in October from 32,048 tons in September while the output of Ontario ovens rose to 85,277 tone from 53,533 tons in the same months. Increased production was largely due to greater iron blast furnace activity as more coke was needed for smelting purposes and the coke plante associated with ste日l works accordingly increased their outputs.

Corresponding with the gain in production, there was an increase in the amount of coal used for coke-making. Canadian coal used for this purpose rose to 84,390 tons frcm 48,468 tons in September and imported coal advanced to 163,660 tons from 109,015 tons in the same time bringing the total consumption of coal for coke-making to 248,050 tons as compared with 157,483 tons in September Each short ton of coke charged to the oven returned 1,300 pounds of coke, an average yild of 65 per cent.

Imports of coke into Canada in October rose to 94,213 tons as compared with 78,731 tons in Septmber whils exports fell slightly to 4,149 tons Prom 4,268 tons in the previous month. Adding the tonnage of coke imported to the Canadian production and deducting the experte, the apparent consumption in October was 251,478 tone or 42 per cent greater than in September when 177,345 tons were made available for use. During the month, 20,207 tons of coke were used in the coking plants, 89,858 tons were delivered to associated metallurgical work and 58,118 tons were sold making a total disposition of 168,183 tons.

During the ten months ending October, 484,707 tons of Canadian coal and $1,288,937$ tons of inported coal were converted into $1,162,761$ tons of coke. In the same time, imports of coke totallod 639,542 tons making a total supply of $1,802,303$ tons, and as exports amounted to 38,159 tons there remained $1,764,144$ tons available for consumption in Canada.

Coke charged to iron blast Purnaces increased to 84,977 tons in October from 39,418 tons in September and during the ten months ending October totalled 498,774 tons.
