COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA

June 1925.

Production of coke in Canada during the month of June receded to 109,694 tons from 130,068 tons in May and 131,484 tons in April. The output in June was 16 per cent less than in May, whereas May showed a decline of 1 per cent from April. A loss in output was reported by all provinces.

Owing to the difficulty of obtaining Canadian coal in eastern Canada, particularly in Nova Scotia where the coal mines have been closed down for several months due to a strike, the consumption of Canadian coal in the manufacture of coke amounted to only 1,122 tons out of a total of 56,775 tons charged to the evens. Throughout the industry the consumption of domestic coal in June was reported as 19,565 tons as against 44,481 tons in the previous month and 75,873 tons in April. Foreign coal charged to coke ovens totalled 141,650 tons in June.

Although exports of coke from Canada fell from 4,968 tons to 3,567 tons and imports rose from 45,954 tons to 55,836 tons the apparent consumption of coke in June amounting to 161,963 tons was 9,091 tons less than in May owing to the loss in output. Coke sales for June at 31,395 tons showed little change from the 31,067 tons in May but the quantity of coke used by the reporting plants or delivered to their associated metallurgical works dropped to 73,364 tons or 12 per cent under the 93,787 tons reported in the preceding month.

For the first half of the year, 308,081 tons of Canadian coal and 786,474 tons of imported coal were converted into 713,847 tons of coke giving an average yield of 1,304 pounds of coke or 65.22 per cent per short ton of coal used. During the same period there was imported into Canada 341,056 tons of coke, making a total supply of 1,054,903 tons but exports totalled 26,052 tons leaving 1,028,851 tons available for use in Canada. During the month Canadian coking plants used 126,156 tons, delivered 349,691 tons to their associated metallurgical works and sold 246,370 tons, making a total disposition of 722,217 tons.

Coke charged to iron blast furnaces in Canada during the first half of year totalled 322,502 tons.
