
November 1926

Production of coke in Canada during the month of November at 154,462 tons was 11 per cent less than the output of 173,592 tons reported for the previous month but only 1 per cent below the 156,182 tons produced in November, 1925.

During the month under review 234,044 tons of coal were carbonized to yield an average of 1,330 pounds for each short ton of coal charged to the ovens, or 66.50 per cent. Of the coal used 79,305 tons were of Canadian origin and the balance, amounting to 154,739 tons, was imported. Disposition of coke by the makers showed that 21,748 tons were used in the coking plants, 52,410 tons were used by the producing companies in their own metallurgical works and 83,307 tons were sold; making a total disposition of 157,465 tons. For the first eleven months of this year the total disposition amounted to 1,747,032 tons.

As November production of coke in Canada was 154,462 tons and 102,987 were imported, there was made available a supply of 257,449 tons, but as 7,597 tons were exported the apparent consumption for the month amounted to 249,852 tons. For the eleven months ending November the cumulative production of coke totalled 1,752,473 tons, imports amounted to 920,811 tons and 52,186 tons were exported, resulting in an apparent consumption of 2,621,098 tons for the year to date.

Coke charged to iron blast furnaces amounted to 58,627 tons in November, making a total of 762,392 tons for the year to date.
