COKE STATISTICS FOR CANADA

No. 6

June 1926

Production of coke in Canada during June amounted to 151,564 tons as compared with 159,390 tons in May, and 109,694 tons in June of last year. Coke plants in eastern Canada had an output of 46,785 tons as compared with 47,685 tons in May; Ontario ovens yielded 87,528 tons as against 92,500 tons in the previous month, while the production from western plants declined to 17,251 tons from 19,025 tons in May.

Imports of coke into Canada during June amounted to 89,632 tons as compared with 66,572 tons in May, and exports totalled 5,250 tons as against 4,973 tons in the previous month. Adding the tonnage of coke imported to the Canadian production and deducting the exports, the apparent consumption of coke in Canada during the month was 235,946 tons as compared with corresponding figures of 220,989 tons in May and 161,963 tons in June of last year.

Disposition of coke by the producing plants showed that 21,479 tons of coke were used in the coking plants, 87,704 tons were delivered to associated metallurgical works, and 38,778 tons were sold, making a total disposition of 144,961 tons for the month.

Coke charged to iron blast furnaces in Canada during June totalled 76,444 tons as compared with 80,678 tons in May.

During the first half of the year 505,569 tons of Canadian coal and 926,901 tons of imported coal were carbonized to produce 934,503 tons of coke giving an average yield of 64.9 per cent or 1,298 pounds of coke for each short ton of coal charged to the ovens. During the same period there was imported into Canada 498,355 tons of coke making a total supply of 1,432,858 tons, but exports totalled 26,914 tons leaving 1,405,944 tons available for use in Canada. In the same period last year production totalled 713,847 tons, imports stood at 341,056 tons and exports amounted to 26,052 tons, the apparent consumption amounting to 1,028,851 tons.
