BALES OF LUBRICATING OILS AND CREASES, 1950

Sales of lubricating oils in Canada during 1950 amounted to 70,427,000 gallons of which 42,625,000 gallons were for motor transport and tractor use, 796,000 gallons were for aircraft and 27,006,000 gallons for industrial and other uses.

Sales of lubricating greases in 1950 totalled 66,719,000 pounds, including 45,782,000 pounds for automotive use and 20,937,000 pounds for industrial use.

These figures were compiled from reports submitted by the principal wholesalers of petroleum oils and greases. Amounts imported direct by users or by retail outlets such as department stores are not included.
