## SALES OF LUBRICATING OILS AND GREASES, 1951

Sales of lubricating oils in Canada during 1951 amounted to 79,786,000 gallons of which 47,962,000 gallons were for motor transport and tractor use, 904,000 gallons were for aircraft and 30,920,000 gallons for industrial and other uses.

Sales of lubricating greases in 1951 totalled 76,681,000 pounds, including 50,364,000 pounds for automotive use and 26,317,000 pounds for industrial use.

These figures were compiled from reports submitted by the principal wholesalers of petroleum oils and greases. Amounts imported direct by users or by retail outlets such as department stores are not included.
