THE COAL TAR DISTILLATION INDUSTRY

1950

Output from the coal tar distillation industry in Canada in 1950 was valued at \$10,033,238 or 8 per cent more than in 1949. Production of creosote oils totalled 11,728,014 gallons at \$2,616,347 in 1950; refined tars amounted to 4,324,803 gallons at \$661,048 and pitch totalled 113,510 tons at \$3,437,514. Phenol, cresols, xylenols, phthalic anhydride, coal tar paints, pitch coke, tar and asphalt cements, disinfectants, and asphalt saturants were other principal products.

Eleven plants operated in 1950, there being 1 in Nova Scotia, 2 in Quebec, 5 in Ontario, 2 in Manitoba and 1 in British Columbia. These works afforded employment to 457 people who were paid \$1,274,395 in salaries and wages.

Materials for manufacturing in 1950 cost \$6,057,087, including 41,324,989 gallons of crude tars at \$4,621,377. In addition, an amount of \$633,181 was paid for fuel and electricity.
