THI INSS IIDUSTRY IN CATVADA, 1929. LIDRAKY
Production from the inks industivy in Canada attained a new high level durine 1929 when the output was vilued at $\$ 3,038,04$. . This rigure was 6 per cent over the total of $22,917,003$ in 1928 amà 7 per cent above the value of $2,830,225$ reported ior 102\%. Production by the 16 concerns chiefly engaged in making printing inks or rollers anourted to 2, ,05.959; this iotal vaiue included $8,146,912$ pounds of pritting and lithograplice inks Worth $2,155,022$, printers: rolle=s worth 298,107 , and small amounts for colours, paints, remistes, ets. Output from the 6 plants ratine writing inis as their main product totalled 334,090 in value and included writing inss, achesives ara snall quantities of other products. The returms from the producers do not give separate figures for writing iniss. In adaivion to the output of writine inis by these concerns there mas a production valued at 200,000 from plants which mace writing inls as a minor product; data for these establishments have not been included in tinis bulletin.

Of these 22 establishments, 13 were in Ontario, 3 in Quebec, 3 in British Columia, 2 in Manitobe, and I in New Brunswicl. Capital omployed in these planis totalied $2,207,203$; employees numbered 322; ank msterials for use in manuracturinf $\cos$ 云 $1,097,31$ 。

Imporits of printing inks into Carada in 1929 amounted to $1,549,659$ pounds valued at $\$ 374,292$ and irupcits on riting inks were given at w44,628. In each case the r'iguzo represented an increase over the comesponding total for 1920.
