## THE INKS INDUSTRY

### 1952

Output of printing inks in 1952 was reported at 22,068,770 pounds valued at \$9,375,202 as against 22,051,887 pounds at \$9,088,296 for 1951, and the value of writing inks was \$458,211 compared with \$426,631 in 1951.

Establishments concerned principally with the manufacture of printing inks numbered 20 in 1952, distributed, by provinces, as follows: 5 in Quebec, 14 in Ontario and 1 in British Columbia. The total production of these concerns was valued at \$9,744,151, including some printers' rollers and other products, as well as printing inks. Employees numbered 724 and salaries and wages for the year amounted to \$2,265,250. Materials for manufacturing cost \$4,325,068 and fuel and electricity cost \$77,955 delivered at the works. Output included 21,972,145 pounds of printing inks at \$9,259,442, printers' rollers at \$416,323 and miscellaneous products worth \$68,386.

Five other establishments—1 in Manitoba, 1 in Ontario, 2 in Quebec and 1 in New Brunswick—made printers' rollers, but no inks. Only 34 workers were employed in these plants and their total output was valued at \$209,086. Including the output from concerns which made printing inks as well as rollers, the total production of the latter was \$623,587 in 1952.

The manufacture of writing inks as a principal product was reported by 3 factories in Quebec, 4 in Ontario, 1 in Manitoba and 1 in British Columbia. These 9 establishments employed 96 persons and made goods valued at \$970,316. Production included writing inks at \$313,921, mucilage and paste at \$112,635 and miscellaneous articles at \$543,760. Writing inks were made also by firms classified to other industry groups. The value reported by the latter in 1952 amounted to \$144,020.

For the entire group, there were 34 establishments which employed 854 workers and produced goods valued at \$10,923,553.

Imports of inks in 1952 included 1,418,520 pounds of printing inks valued at \$728,685;402,689 pounds of rotogravure inks at \$30,315 and writing inks valued at \$56,527. Exports included 103,898 pounds of printing inks at \$39,322 and other inks worth \$8,293.

Note: Data presented in this bulletin for 1952 under the heading of "Production" actually represent "Factory Shipments" and therefore, are not exactly comparable with previous years.
