

THE INKS INDUSTRY

1954

Output of printing inks in 1954 was reported at 26,854,350 pounds valued at \$11,648,790 as against 25,735,017 pounds at \$11,125,566 for 1953. The value of writing inks, including output reported by firms classified to other industry groups, was \$516,418 compared with \$492,930 in 1953.

Establishments concerned principally with the manufacture of printing inks numbered 20 in 1954, distributed, by provinces, as follows: 4 in Quebec, 15 in Ontario and 1 in British Columbia. Factory shipments reported by these concerns were valued at \$12,010,965, including some printers' rollers and other products as well as printing inks. Employees numbered 832 and salaries and wages for the year amounted to \$2,829,454. Materials for manufacturing cost \$4,603,391 and fuel and electricity cost \$99,414 delivered at the works. Output included 26,752,500 pounds of printing inks at \$11,530,858, printers' rollers at \$427,647 and miscellaneous products worth \$52,460.

Five other establishments - 1 in Manitoba, 1 in Ontario, 2 in Quebec and 1 in New Brunswick - made printers' rollers, but no inks. Only 35 workers were employed in these plants and their total output was valued at \$258,487. Including the output from concerns which made printing inks as well as rollers, the total production of the latter was \$676,912 in 1954.

The manufacture of writing inks was reported by 8 factories in this industry, 3 in Quebec, 3 in Ontario, 1 in Manitoba and 1 in British Columbia. These establishments employed 97 persons and made goods valued at \$1,127,038. Production included writing inks at \$375,616, mucilage and paste at \$116,662 and miscellaneous articles at \$634,760. Writing inks were made also by firms classified to other industry groups. The value reported by the latter in 1954 amounted to \$140,802.

For the entire group there were 33 establishments which employed 964 workers and produced goods valued at \$13,396,490.

Imports of inks in 1954 included 1,940,935 pounds of printing inks valued at \$920,815; 587,125 pounds of rotogravure inks at \$171,507 and writing inks valued at \$83,522. Exports included 56,031 pounds of printing inks at \$32,706 and other inks worth \$10,384.

Note: Figures for value added by manufacture shown in Table 1 prior to 1952 were obtained by subtracting the cost of materials used, including fuel and electricity, from the value of production. In 1952, the gross value of production was replaced by value of factory shipments, f.o.b. plant. As no information on inventory change is available for 1952 and 1953, value added figures for these years were obtained by subtracting from the value of shipments the cost of materials, fuel and electricity. In 1954, information on the value of year-end inventory holdings at plant and plant warehouses was collected as part of the annual Census of Industry and information thus made available was taken into account in calculating the value added figure for 1954.


