THE INKS INDUSTRY

1955

Output of printing inks in 1955 was reported at 28,428,340 pounds valued at \$12,783,015 as against 26,854,350 pounds at \$11,648,790 in 1954. The value of writing inks, including output reported by firms classified to other industry groups, was \$543,147 compared with \$516,418 in 1954.

Establishments concerned principally with the manufacture of printing inks numbered 22 in 1955 distributed by provinces as follows: 4 in Quebec, 16 in Ontario and 2 in British Columbia. Factory shipments reported by these concerns were valued at \$13,174,116, including some printers' rollers and other products as well as printing inks. Employees numbered 853 and salaries and wages for the year amounted to \$3,055,401. Materials for manufacturing cost \$5,380,233 and fuel and electricity cost \$108,649 delivered at the works. Output included 28,151,540 pounds of printing inks at \$12,675,548, printers' rollers at \$422,278 and miscellaneous products worth \$76,290.

Five other establishments—1 in Manitoba, 1 in Ontario, 2 in Quebec and 1 in New Brunswick—made printers' rollers, but no inks. Only 39 workers were employed in these plants and their total output, including other products as well as rollers, was valued at \$391,404. The total output of rollers, including the output from concerns which made printing inks as well as rollers, was \$669,260.

The manufacture of writing inks was reported by 8 factories in this industry, 3 in Quebec, 3 in Ontario, 1 in Manitoba and 1 in British Columbia. These establishments employed 94 persons and made goods valued at \$1,182,642. Production included writing inks at \$376,983, mucilage and paste at \$118,670 and miscellaneous articles at \$686,989. Writing inks were also made by firms classified to other industry groups. The value reported by the latter in 1955 amounted to \$154,912.

For the entire group there were 35 establishments which employed 996 workers and produced goods valued at \$14,748,162.

Imports of inks in 1955 included 1,828,183 pounds of printing inks valued at \$1,008,680; 971,140 pounds of rotogravure inks at \$255,686 and writing inks valued at \$103,265. Exports included 137,546 pounds of printing inks at \$39,107 and other inks worth \$28,172.

Note: Figures for value added by manufacture, shown in Tables 1 and 2, prior to 1952 were obtained by subtracting the cost of materials used, including fuel and electricity, from the value of production. In 1952, the gross value of production was replaced by value of factory shipments, 1.0.b. plant. As no information on inventory change is available for 1952 and 1953, value added figures for these years were obtained by subtracting from the value of shipments the cost of materials, fuel and electricity. In 1954 and 1955, information on the value of year-end inventory holdings at plant and plant warehouses was collected as part of the annual Census of Industry and information thus made available was taken into account in calculating the value added figure for 1954 and 1955.

(b) Beginning with 1954, information on the value of year-end inventory holdings at plant and plant warehouses is being collected as part of the annual Census of Industry. These data were formerly collected by a separate survey. The summarized results for the Inks Industry for the year under review are shown in the above table.

(c) The opening inventory for 1955 does not necessarily agree with the closing inventory for 1954 because of revisions such as the addition of new plants, the transfer of plants to other industries and plants going out of business. However, the value added figures for the previous year have not been recalculated to allow for the revisions mentioned above.


