THE INKS INDUSTRY

1957

Output of printing inks in 1957 was reported at 30,174,862 pounds valued at \$14,809,936 as against 30,134,128 pounds valued at \$13,695,626 in 1956. The value of writing inks, including output reported by firms classified to other industrial groups, was \$488,707 compared with \$576,694 in 1956.

Establishments concerned principally with the manufacture of printing inks numbered 21 in 1957 distributed by provinces as follows: 3 in Quebec, 15 in Ontario and 3 in British Columbia. Factory shipments reported by these firms were valued at \$14,986,212 including some printers' rollers and other products as well as printing inks. Employees numbered 834 and salaries and wages for the year amounted to \$3,538,035. Materials for manufacturing cost \$6,189,193 and fuel and electricity cost \$116,669 delivered at works. Output included 29,917,562 pounds of printing inks at \$14,670,526 printers' rollers at \$247,871 and miscellaneous products worth \$67,815.

Five other establishments, 1 in New Brunswick, 2 in Quebec, 1 in Ontario and 1 in Manitoba, made printers' rollers, but no inks. Only 48 workers were employed in these plants and their total output,

including other products as well as rollers, was valued at \$537,894. The total output of rollers, including the output from concerns which made printing inks as well as rollers, was \$763,927.

The manufacture of writing inks was reported by 7 factories in this industry, 2 in Quebec, 3 in Ontario, 1 in Manitoba and 1 in British Columbia. These establishments employed 95 persons who made goods valued at \$1,388,224. Production included writing inks at \$357,012, mucilage and paste at \$97,578 and miscellaneous articles at \$933,634. Writing inks were also made by firms classified to other industrial groups. The value reported by the latter in 1957 amounted to \$131,695.

For the entire group there were 32 establishments which employed 977 workers and produced goods valued at \$16.912.330.

Imports of inks in 1957 included 2,345,088 pounds of printing inks valued at \$1,178,315; 1,043,292 pounds of rotogravure ink at \$267,005 and writing inks valued at \$130,442. Exports included 117,402 pounds of printing inks at \$33,825 and other inks worth \$12,262.

Due to lack of inventory data, figures for "Value added by manufacture" prior to 1954 were obtained by subtracing the cost of materials used, including fuel and electricity, from the total value of factory shipments. In 1954 and 1955 the "Value added" adjustment incorporated the increase or decrease to shipments values resulting from changes in the value of inventories over the period. For these two years, the adjustments that were made used only the change in finished product inventory owned by manufacturers. Beginning with 1956 the calculation of the "Value added" figure was further adjusted to take into account the "Goods in process" as well as the finished goods held at plant or plant warehouse.

Note: Profits or losses cannot be calculated from above figures as data are not available for general expense items, such as interest, rent, depreciation, taxes, insurance, advertising, etc.

(b) Beginning with 1954, information on the value of year-end inventory holdings at plant and plant warehouses is being collected as part of the annual Census of Industry. These data were formerly collected by a separate survey. The summarized results for the Inks Industry for the year under review are shown in the above table.

(c) The opening inventory for the current year may not necessarily agree with the closing inventory published the previous year because of changes in the composition of the industry such as; the addition of new establishments, the disappearance of old ones, or the transfer of establishments to other industries for statistical purposes. The figure for value added by manufacture for the previous year does not need to be altered because of such changes in the composition of the industry. industry.
