ANNUAL INDUSTRY REPORTCHEMICALS AND ALLIED PRODUCTS GROUPTHE PAINTS AND VARNISHES INDUSTRY, 1946

Manufacturers of paints and varnishes reported production at \$56,729,620 in 1946, compared with \$48,396,502 in 1945. These values are not quite comparable with industry totals for earlier years as the plants engaged in making white lead and other pigments were re-classified to another category in 1945.

The number of plants in this industry increased to 98, distributed by provinces as follows: Ontario, 52; Quebec, 27; British Columbia, 10; Manitoba, 5; and 1 in each of Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Saskatchewan and Alberta. Works in Ontario accounted for approximately 47 per cent of the total production and establishments in Quebec for about 38 per cent.

Total production in Canada of some of the leading items (including small amounts from other industries) was as follows in 1946: 9,770,046 gallons of ready-mixed paints at \$25,236,007; 3,439,056 gallons of varnishes at \$6,986,566; 3,804,402 gallons of enamels at \$12,073,681; 1,581,131 gallons of cellulose lacquers at \$4,271,928; 8,127,248 pounds of paste paints at \$1,148,195; 12,156,658 pounds of putty at \$521,689 and 1,170,520 gallons of pyroxylin thinners at \$1,389,349.
