THE PAINTS AND VARNISHES INDUSTRY, 1948

Manufacturers of paints and varnishes reported production at \$81,278,591 in 1948 compared with \$69,912,278 in 1947.

The number of plants in this industry increased to 114, distributed by provinces as follows: Ontario, 58; Quebec, 34; British Columbia, 12; Manitoba, 5; Nova Scotia, 2; and 1 in each of New Brunswick, Saskatchewan and Alberta. Works in Ontario accounted for approximately 50 per cent of the total production and establishments in Quebec for about 37 per cent.

Total production in Canada of some of the leading items (including small amounts from other industries) was as follows in 1948: 10,825,269 gallons of ready-mixed paints at \$35,894,810; 3,513,763 gallons of varnishes at \$8,543,101; 5,130,958 gallons of enamels at \$20,820,354; 1,748,047 gallons of cellulose lacquers at \$5,180,692; 5,619,500 pounds of paste paints at \$981,761; 12,644,973 pounds of putty at \$870,006 and 1,362,286 gallons of pyroxylin thinners at \$1,643,355.
