THE PAINTS, VARNISHES AND LACQUERS INDUSTRY, 1954

Manufacturers of paints and varnishes reported factory shipments of \$107,727,373 in 1954 compared with \$113,247,805 in 1953.

A total of 124 plants was included in this group during 1954, distributed by provinces as follows: Ontario, 66; Quebec, 35; British Columbia, 13; Manitoba, 5; Nova Scotia, 2 and 1 each in Newfoundland, New Brunswick and Alberta. Works in Ontario accounted for approximately 53 per cent of the total shipments and establishments in Quebec for about 34 per cent.

Factory shipments in Canada of some of the leading items (including small amounts from other industries) were as follows in 1954: 11,446,000 gallons of ready-mixed paints at \$40,866,000; 3,012,000 gallons of varnishes at \$8,073,000;

2,279,000 gallons of lacquers at \$6,959,000; 2,627,000 pounds of paste paints at \$713,000; water paints (including latex emulsion paints) at \$11,206,000; 10,341,000 pounds of putty at \$769,000 and 2,277,000 gallons of thinners at \$3,143,000.

Note: Figures for value added by manufacture shown in Table 1 prior to 1952 were obtained by subtracting the cost of materials used, including fuel and electricity, from the value of production. In 1952, the gross value of production was replaced by value of factory shipments, f.o.b. plant. As no information on inventory change is available for 1952 and 1953, value added figures for these years were obtained by subtracting from the value of shipments the cost of materials, fuel and electricity. In 1954, information on the value of year-end inventory holdings at plant and plant warehouses was collected as part of the annual Census of Industry and information thus made available was taken into account in calculating the value added figure for 1954.


