THE POLISHES AND DRESSINGS INDUSTRY IN CANADA, 1929.

Production from the polishes and dressings industry in Canada during 1929 amounted in value to \$1,356,225, a decline of 3 per cent from the \$1,396,675 reported in 1928, according to a statement issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. Of the 29 firms which produced polishes or dressings as their major products, 16 were located in Ontario, 11 in Quebec, 1 in Manitoba, and 1 in British Columbia. These firms had fixed and working capital of \$1,253,657 and afforded employment to a monthly average of 216 people who received \$279,571 as salaries and wages. Materials purchased for manufacturing cost \$630,861 and the value added by manufacturing processes was \$725,362.

Among the principal products of this industry were included shoe polishes and dressings worth \$288,503, furniture polish at \$212,026, stove polish at \$191,753, metal polish at \$94,432 and other similar lines.

The production of floor waxes and floor polishes in other industries amounted in value to \$356,147 in 1929, and other polishes of all kinds to a value of \$32,110 were made in other groups.
