## THE POLISHES AND DRESSINGS INDUSTRY, 1947

The Polishes and Dressings Industry includes only the factories which were occupied chiefly in the manufacture of polishes, floor wax and other similar preparations. In 1947 there were 55 establishments in this category, located by provinces as follows: 33 in Ontario, 20 in Quebec and 2 in British Columbia.

Production from these establishments was valued at $\$ 8,736,037$ in 1947 compared with $\$ 9,558,330$ in 1946 and $\$ 3,091,054$ in 1945. About 69 per cent of the total came from plants in Ontario and British Columbia, and 31 per cent from Quebec plants.

Output of polishes and floor wax during 1947, including small amounts from other industries, was as follows: paste floor wax, 7,382,666 pounds at $\$ 2,062,252$; Iquid iloor wax and polish, 1,228,267 gallons at $\$ 3,175,202$; shoe polishes and dressings at $\$ 810,245$; furniture polishes at $\$ 363,535$; stove polishes at $\$ 61,232$; brass polishes at $\$ 47,575$; silver polishes at $\$ 104,885$; auto polishes at $\$ 147,719$, and miscellaneous polishes at $\$ 68,745$. The total value of all polishes, including polishing wax, was $\$ 6,841,390$ in 1947 compared with $\$ 7,630,054$ in 1946 and $\$ 6,652,276$ in 1945 .
