THE POLISHES AND DRESSINGS INDUSTRY, 1948

The Polishes and Dressings Industry includes only the factories which were occupied chiefly in the manufacture of polishes, floor wax and other similar preparations. In 1948 there were 53 establishments in this category, located by provinces as follows: 30 in Ontario, ?l in Quebec and ? in British Columbia.

Production from these establishments was valued at $\$ 10,080,458$ in 1948 compared with $\$ 8,736,037$ in 1947 and $\$ 9,558,330$ in 1946 . About 71 per cent of the total came from plants in Ontario and British Columbia and 29 per cent from Quebec plants.

Output of polishes and floor wax during 1948, including small amounts from other industries, was as follows: paste floor wax, 7,799,068 pounds at $\$ 2,253,503$; liquid floor wax and polish, $1,728,005$ gallons at $\$ 4,540,167$; shoe polishes and dressings at $\$ 791,623$; furniture polishes at $\$ 403,187$; stove polishes at $\$ 55,083$; brass polishes at $\$ 50,642$; silver polishes at $\$ 125,380$; auto polishes at $\$ 226,055$, and miscellaneous polishes at $\$ 57,009$. The total value ol all polishes, including polishing wax, was $\$ 3,54 \%, 345$ in 15483 compared with $\$ 6,866,057$ in 1847 and $\$ 7,630,054$ in 1946.
