



THE POLISHES AND DRESSINGS INDUSTRY

1949

The Polishes and Dressings Industry includes only the factories which were occupied chiefly in the manufacture of polishes, floor wax and other similar preparations. In 1949 there were 57 establishments in this category, located by provinces as follows: 36 in Ontario, 18 in Quebec and 3 in British Columbia.

Production from these establishments was valued at \$11,865,149 in 1949 compared with \$10,080,458 in 1948. About 72 per cent of the total came from plants in Ontario and 28 per cent from establishments in Quebec.

Output of polishes and floor wax during 1949, including small amounts from other industries, was as follows; paste floor wax, 7,695,107 pounds at \$2,498,256; liquid floor wax and polish, 1,739,688 gallons at \$4,790,192; shoe polishes and dressings at \$1,020,394; furniture polishes at \$425,568; stove polishes at \$66,833; brass polishes at \$61,190; silver polishes at \$127,365; auto polishes at \$364,409, and miscellaneous polishes at \$336,420. The total value of all polishes, including polishing wax, was \$9,690,627 in 1949 compared with \$8,543,349 in 1948.
