THE POLISHES AND DRESSINGS INDUSTRY

1950

The Polishes and Dressings Industry includes only the factories which were occupied chiefly in the manufacture of polishes, floor wax and other similar preparations. In 1950 there were 54 establishments in this category, located by provinces as follows: 33 in Ontario, 17 in Quebec and 4 in British Columbia.

Production from these establishments was valued at \$13,377,393 in 1950 compared with \$11,865,149 in 1949. About 74 per cent of the total came from plants in Ontario and 26 per cent from establishments in Quebec.

Output of polishes and floor wax during 1950, including small amounts from other industries, was as follows: paste floor wax, 7,536,186 pounds at \$2,476,668; liquid floor wax and polish, 2,346,737 gallons at \$5,592,614; shoe polishes and dressings at \$969,551; furniture polishes at \$521,424; stove polishes at \$73,786; brass polishes at \$55,014; silver polishes at \$110,561; auto polishes at \$925,984, and miscellaneous polishes at \$649,500. The total value of all polishes, including polishing wax, was \$11,375,102 in 1950 compared with \$9,690,627 in 1949.
