Imports of soap into Canada during the calendar year 1932 were valued at \$971,594. This total included 4,460 tons of common laundry soap, mostly from the United States, 558 tons of castile soap, mostly from France; 93 tons of soap powders; \$148,805 of 'other-toilet' soaps; 34 tons of liquid soap, and smaller quantities of harness, whale oil, pumice and mineral soaps.

Exports of soaps in the year under review were valued at \$395,117 and included 2,273 tons of toilet soap worth \$379,198 and 181 tons of other soap valued at \$15,919.
