#### ANNUAL INDUSTRY REPORT

#### CHEMICALS AND ALLIED PRODUCTS GROUP

#### THE SOAPS, WASHING COMPOUNDS AND CLEANING PREPARATIONS INDUSTRY, 1938

In 1938, a total of 109 factories in Canada made soaps, washing compounds or cleaning preparations as their main products. Production from these works was valued at \$18,241,985 or 7.1 per cent less than the output of \$19,693,888 from the 101 establishments in this category in 1937. Employees numbered 2,273 against 2,284 in 1937, salaries and wages amounted to \$2,942,456 compared with \$2,836,208 and capital employed totalled \$13,346,856 as against \$14,201,659 in the previous year. Five large factories accounted for about 75 per cent of the production, 69 per cent of the capital and 61 per cent of the employees.

Forty-six of the plants were engaged primarily in the manufacture of soaps, 23 being in Ontario, 11 in Quebec, 5 in Alberta, 3 in Manitoba, 3 in British Columbia and 1 in New Brunswick. These establishments reported 1,907 workers with production valued at \$16,506,844. In 1937 there were 41 soap factories with 1,927 employees and a production of \$18,012,675.

Thirty-five establishments made washing compounds as their main product, 17 being located in Quebec, 11 in Ontario, 3 in Manitoba, 3 in British Columbia and 1 in Alberta. Their output was valued at \$586,979 and employees numbered 169 compared with production at \$542,203 and employees at 166 for the 34 plants reporting in this division for 1937. Javelle water and sodium hypochlorite were the chief products.

Twenty-eight establishments made cleaning preparations as their main product in 1938. Fourteen were located in Ontario, 10 in Quebec, 2 in Manitoba and 2 in British Columbia. Production amounted to \$1,148,162 and the number of employees was 197 while the corresponding data for 1937 showed 26 plants employing 191 people and output valued at \$1,139,010. The main products were cleaning powders, hand cleaner and drain pipe cleaner.

Tables 1 to 15 inclusive, of this report, refer only to the Soaps, Washing Compounds and Cleaning Preparations Industry which includes the firms reporting these lines as their chief products. Small quantities of these commodities were made also by concerns which have been classified to other industrial groups, so Table 16 has been added to show the total Canadian production. This table shows that the output for Canada during 1938 included the following: 16,267 tons of toilet soaps valued at \$4,408,625; 28,807 tons of bar laundry and household soaps at \$2,946,304; 18,897 tons of soap chips and flakes at \$2,697,530; 19,214 tons of soap powders at \$2,950,025; 2,398 tons of textile and mill soaps at \$309,479; 1,529 tons of castile soap at \$276,393; 513 tons of shaving soaps and creams at \$723,854; 1,098 tons of liquid soaps at \$162,170; 879 tons of soft soaps at \$118,350; 7,172 tons of cleaning and scouring powders, etc. at \$860,347, javelle water and sodium hypochlorite valued at \$531,589.

Imports of soaps into Canada during the calendar year 1933 were valued at \$459,503. This total included 1,602 tons of laundry soap at \$202,339, 407 tons of castile soap at \$43,169, 335 tons of soap powders at \$39,815, 89 tons of liquid soap at \$13,546 and toilet soaps at \$121,231.

Exports of soaps were appraised at \$1,419,051 in 1938 compared with \$1,256,815 in 1937. The principal export during the year was 7,523 tons of toilet soap valued at \$1,394,753 and of this item 7,209 tons worth \$1,263,994 went to the United Kingdom.
