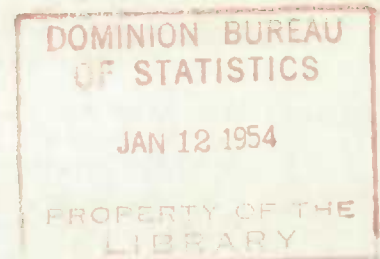

THE SOAPS, WASHING COMPOUNDS AND CLEANING PREPARATIONS INDUSTRY

1952

In 1952 a total of 136 factories in Canada made soaps, washing compounds or cleaning preparations as their main products. Factory shipments from these works were valued at \$84,461,282. Employees numbered 3,756 compared with 3,742 in 1951; salaries and wages amounted to \$12,755,324 against \$11,506,281 in the previous year.

Fifty-two of the plants were engaged primarily in the manufacture of soaps, 23 being in Ontario, 15 in Quebec, 9 in British Columbia, 3 in Manitoba and 2 in Alberta. These establishments reported 3,032 workers with factory shipments valued at \$72,849,786.

Forty-four establishments made washing compounds as their main products, 19 being located in Quebec, 16 in Ontario, 4 in British Columbia, 3 in Alberta and 1 each in Newfoundland and Manitoba. Their output was valued at \$6,847,617 and employees numbered 429. Salaries and wages paid to the latter totalled \$1,048,981. Javelle water and sodium hypochlorite were the chief products.

Forty establishments made cleaning preparations as their main products in 1952; 24 plants were located in Ontario, 11 in Quebec, 3 in British Columbia and 2 in Manitoba. Factory shipments

were valued at \$4,763,879, employees numbered 295 and salaries and wages paid amounted to \$760,923. The main products were cleaning powders, hand cleaners and drain pipe cleaners.

Tables 1 to 5 and 10 and 11 of this report refer only to the Soaps, Washing Compounds and Cleaning Preparations Industry which includes the firms reporting these lines as their chief products. Small quantities of these commodities were made also by concerns which have been classified to other industrial groups, so Table 6 has been added to show the total Canadian production. This table shows that the output for Canada during 1952 included the following: 18,543 tons of toilet soaps valued at \$10,353,000; 11,855 tons of bar laundry and household soaps at \$3,580,000; 10,355 tons of soap chips and flakes at \$3,725,000; 43,538 tons of soap powders at \$16,702,000; 2,510 tons of textile and mill soaps at \$656,000; 686 tons of castile soap at \$271,000; 814 tons of shaving soaps and creams at \$2,174,000; 5,802 tons of liquid soaps at \$1,307,000; 2,002 tons of soft soaps at \$453,000; cleaning and scouring powders, etc., at \$3,823,000 and javelle water valued at \$6,367,000. Factory shipments of synthetic detergents amounted to 43,372 tons valued at \$21,382,000.

Note: Data presented in this bulletin for 1952 under the heading of "Production" actually represent "Factory Shipments" and, therefore, are not exactly comparable with previous years.

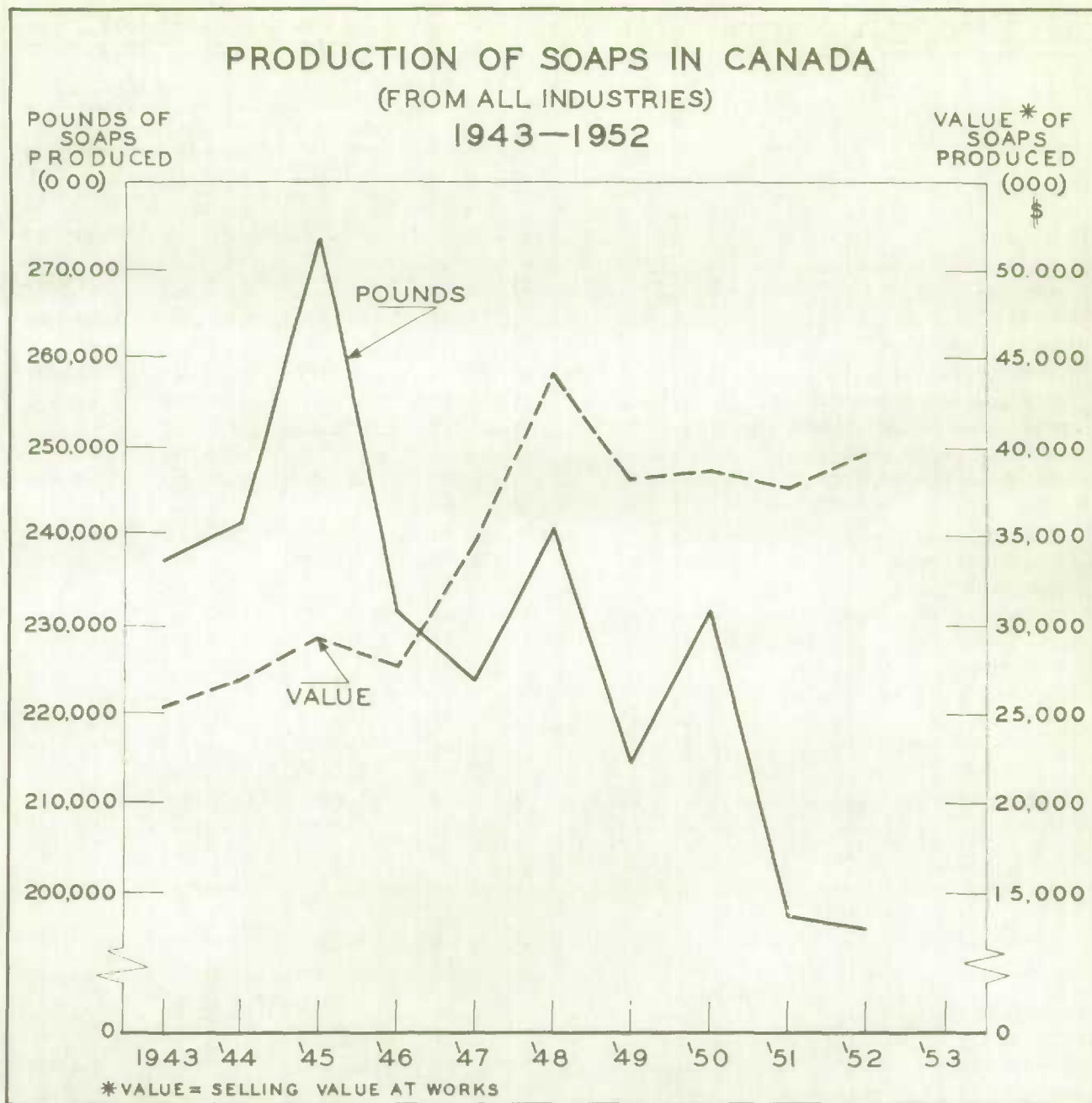
