For statistical purposes the industry titled Manufacturers of Soap and Cleaning Compounds in the revised Standard Industrial Classification covers the operations of establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing soap in any form, synthetic detergents, cleaners, washing powders and cleaning preparations including scouring powders and hand cleansers. This industry also includes establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing household laundry bleaches and blueing.

Value of shipments and other revenue of Manufacturers of Soap and Cleaning Compounds industry totalled \$248.7 millions. This amount included shipments of soaps, detergents, other washing compounds and cleaning preparations valued at \$157.4 millions, shipments of other products (secondary products) valued at \$65.8 millions and other revenue of \$25.5 millions.

This industry's shipments of soaps, detergents, other washings compounds and cleaning preparations represented 70.5 per cent of its manufacturing revenue. Secondary products shipped in 1967 included glycerine, floorwax, toilet preparations, shortening, margarine, refined oils, etc.

The cost of materials and supplies, etc. used in the production of goods of own manufacture decreased by \$200,000. Cost of materials and supplies, etc. (input) in 1967 represented 46.7 per cent of the value of shipments of own manufacture (outputs), compared to 48.3 per cent in 1966.

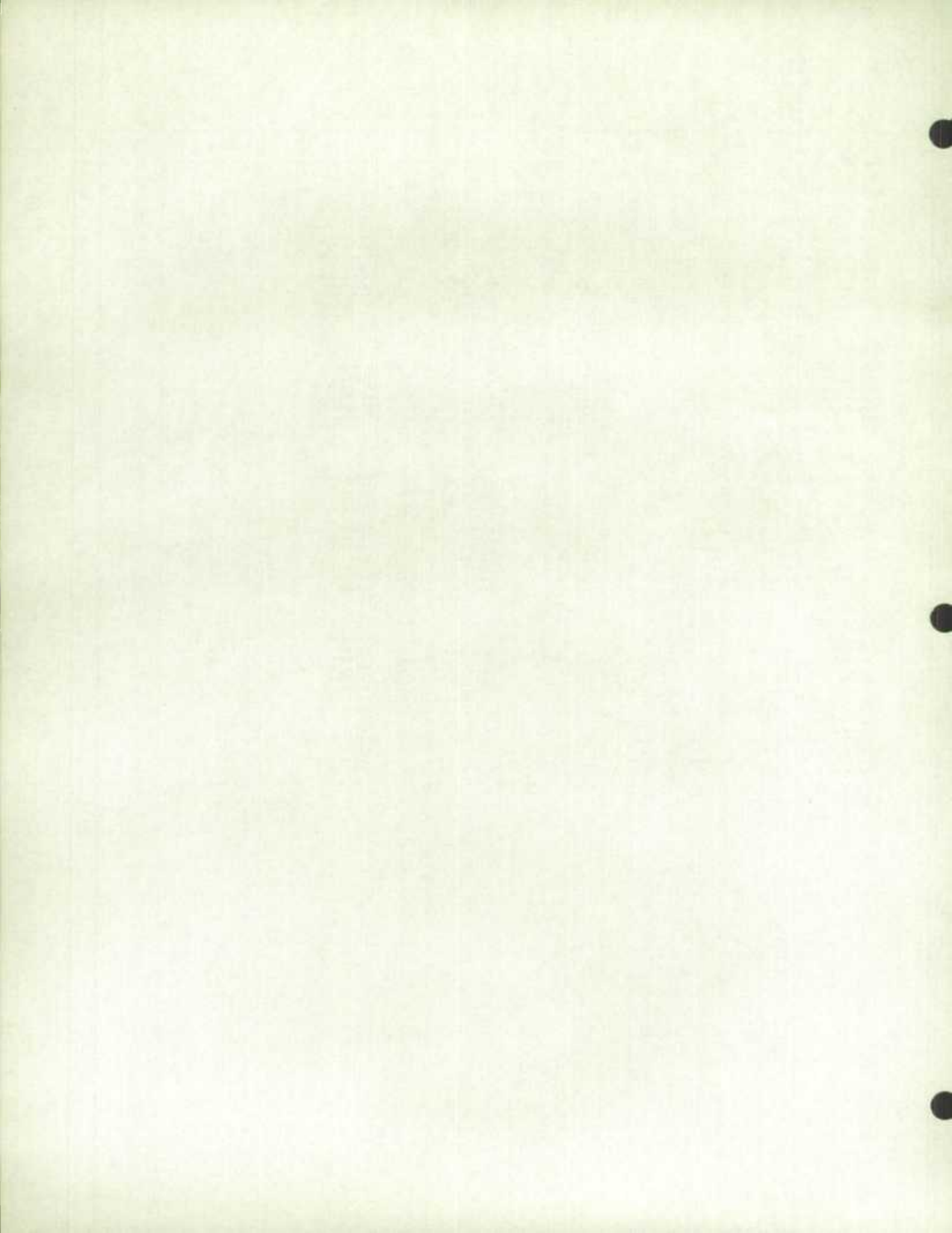

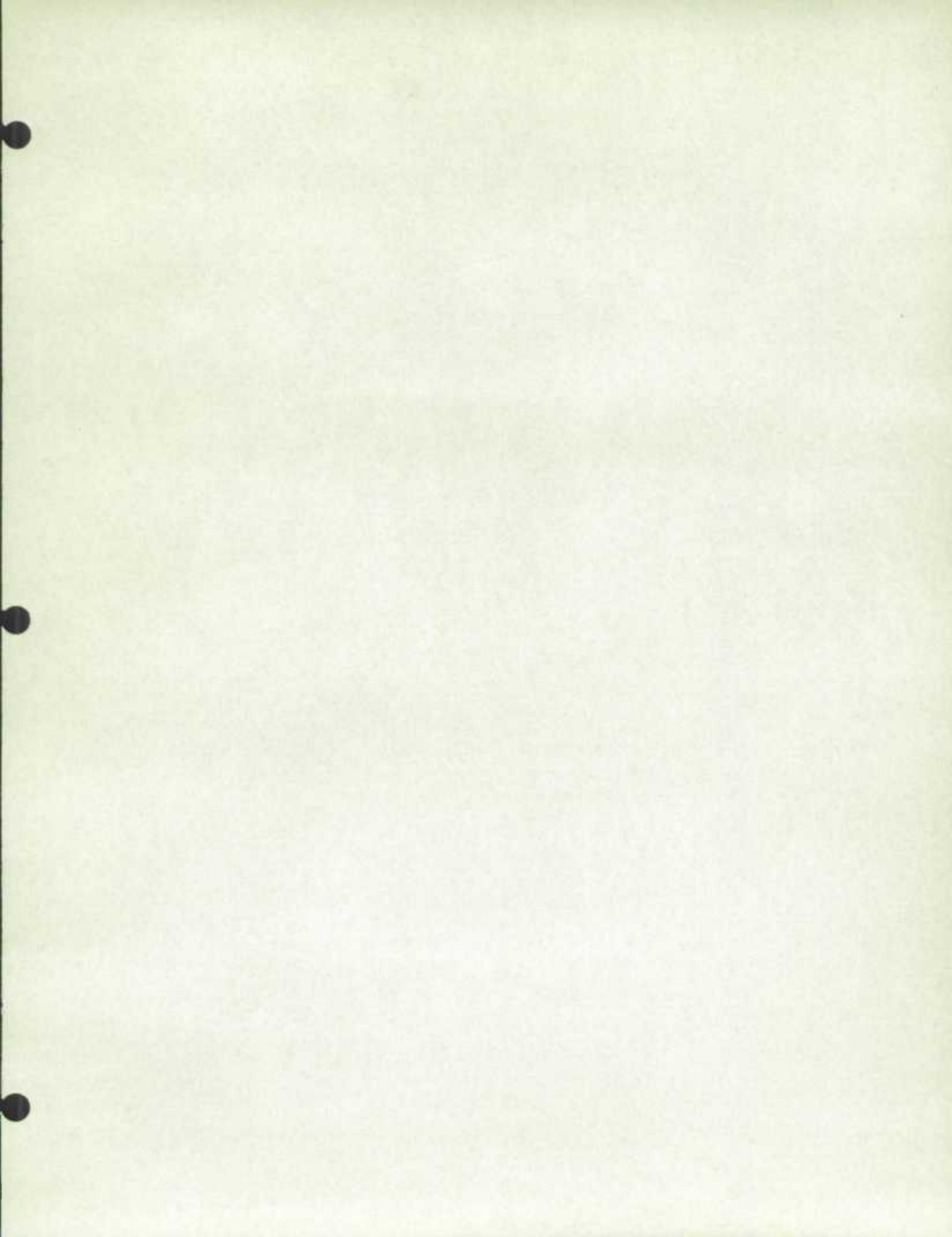

NOTES TO USERS

1. The detailed explanations of "Concepts and Definitions" omitted from this report may be consulted in any 1965 report in this series. If not available to the user, the relevant pages may be obtained free of charge from the Manufacturing and Primary Industries Division of the Bureau.
2. Tables on principal statistics classified by manufacturing value added, by total value added, and by type of organization, published in the 1966 report as Tables 3, 4 and 6, respectively, have been omitted from this report because of their limited interest. They are available, however, from the Manufacturing and Primary Industries Division. In the case of an extensive request involving a large number of industries, it may be necessary to levy a charge.
3. Users interested in obtaining the value of production (manufacturing activity) can do so by adding cost of materials and supplies used (manufacturing activity), cost of fuel and electricity, and value added (manufacturing activity). The resulting statistic is equivalent in concept to "gross output" shown in Table 7 of the 1966 report.
