## CHEMICALS AND ALLIED PRODTCTS

## THE TOILFT PRFPARATIONS INDUSTRY, 1933.

The toilet preparations industry, as reviewed in the present bulletin, includes only those concerns which manufacture as their chief products, such articles as toilet creans, hair tonics, face powders, tooth paste, perfumes, etc. In adilition there is a considerable number of manifacturers who make toilet preparations as a minor part of their output and therefore are classed in other industrial groups. Chief of these are some soap producers and the makers of patent medicines and pharmaceuticals. Only about 70 per cent of the Canadian output of toilet essentials is produced in the toilet preparations industry as it is defined for purposes of this report. However, statistics for this industry are show separately as they are important as being representative of the manufacture of toilet preparations. In order to make the prociuction figures complete, tables 11 to 13 are appended to show the total output of toilet preparations from all industries.

In 1933, a total of 80 plants were included in this industry; 52 were in Ontario, 20 in Quebec, 4 in Manitoba and 4 in British Colunbia. Production from these works was valued at $\$ 5,477,324$ including $\$ 4,291,189$ for toilet preparations and ©1,186,135 for other products. Capital employed in manufacturing operations amounted to $\$ 4,817,533$, employees numbered 934 and salaries and wages totalled 898,224 . Compared with 1932 there was a gain of 3 plants and 59 employees but a decline of 8 per cent in production, 12 per cent in capital and 6 per cent in salaries and wages.

Imports of toilet preparations into Canada were valued at $\$ 433,723$ in 1933 compared with $\$ 737,274$ in 1932. About 45 per cent of the imports came from the United States, 27 per cent from France and 26 per cent from the United Kingdom.

The total production of toilet preparations in Canada from all industries amounted to $\$ 5,912,162$ in 1933 at factory values compared with $\$ 6,957,862$ in 1937 .
