

THE TOILET PREPARATIONS INDUSTRY

1954

Factory shipments from the Toilet Preparations Industry were valued at \$31,943,143 in 1954 compared with \$30,438,474 in 1953 and \$27,059,783 in 1952.

In the annual census of manufacturing establishments in Canada the operating firms are arranged in a number of industrial groups to which the various factories are classified in accordance with the nature of their main products. Under this arrangement, the Toilet Preparations Industry includes all establishments which are occupied chiefly in making perfumes, toilet waters, face creams, tooth pastes, etc., but in 1954 this industry actually accounted for only about 68 per cent of the Canadian output of toilet preparations as a number of concerns in other industries made this class of goods as a minor or secondary part of their business. Note: Figures for value added by manufacture shown in Table 1 prior to 1952 were obtained by subtracting the cost of materials used, including fuel and electricity, from the value of production. In 1952, the gross value of production was replaced by value of factory shipments, f.o.b. plant. As no information on inventory change is available for 1952 and 1953, value added figures for these years were obtained by subtracting from the value of shipments the cost of materials, fuel and electricity. In 1954, information on the value of year-end inventory holdings at plant and plant warehouses was collected as part of the annual Census of Industry and information thus made available was taken into account in calculating the value added figure for 1954.

this report the data are for the Toilet Preparations Industry as defined for census purposes, but Tables 5 and 6 have been added to show the total output of toilet preparations regardless of the industry in which produced.

In 1954, there were 94 establishments in this industry, 54 being located in Ontario, 33 in Quebec, 4 in British Columbia, 2 in Manitoba and 1 in Saskatchewan. Output from these concerns totalled \$31,943,143, including \$27,876,606 for toilet preparations and \$4,066,537 for other products. Employees numbered 2,048 and salaries and wages amounted to \$5,147,118.

Factory shipments of toilet preparations from all industries were valued at \$40,974,000 at factory prices in 1954. In 1953 the comparable value was \$39,478,000 and in 1952 it was \$37,281,000.
