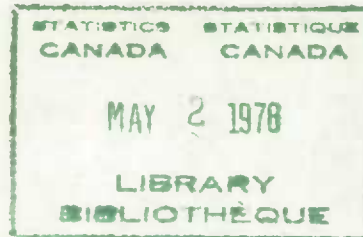

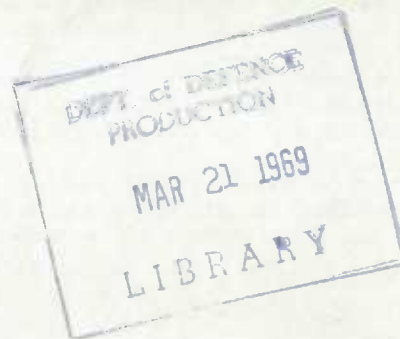

MANUFACTURERS OF TOILET PREPARATIONS

(S.I.C. 377)

1966

For statistical purposes the industry titled Manufacturers of Toilet Preparations in the revised Standard Industrial Classification covers the operations of establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing perfumes, cosmetics, lotions, hair dressings, toothpaste and other toilet preparations.

Value of shipments and other revenue of the Manufacturers of Toilet Preparations industry totalled \$122 millions, an increase of \$8 millions over 1965. This amount included shipments of toilet preparations valued at \$97 millions, shipments of other products (secondary products) valued at \$13 millions and other revenue of \$12 millions.

This industry's shipments of toilet preparations represented 86.4 per cent of its manufacturing revenue. Secondary products shipped in 1966 included shaving cream, toilet soap, medicinal and pharmaceutical preparations, deodorants, disinfectants, etc.

The cost of materials and supplies, fuel and electricity, etc. (inputs) used in the production of goods of own manufacture, increased by \$4 millions. Cost of inputs, in 1966 represented 35.0 per cent of the value of shipments of own manufacture (outputs), compared to 33.5 per cent in 1965.

NOTE

The detailed "Concepts and Definitions" notes, usually carried each year, have been omitted from this 1966 report for reasons of economy. Reference to these notes may be had by consulting any 1965 report in this series.
